New Trier Girls Club Invites Residents to Christmas Sale December 6; Arrange Many Novelties

The Girls' club of New Trier will sponsor a Christmas bazaar to be given Saturday, December 6, at the New Trier mess hall. The affair will open in the early afternoon and continue until the evening. 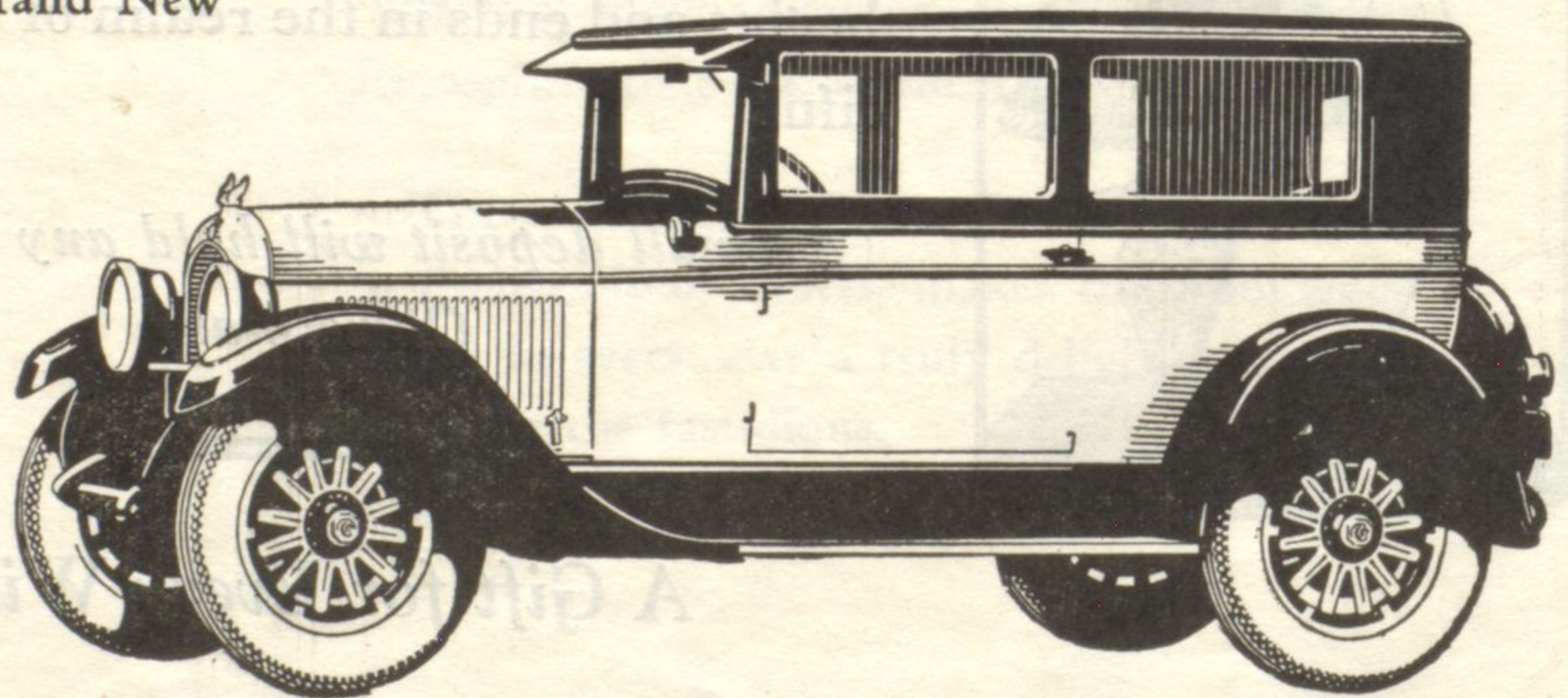
