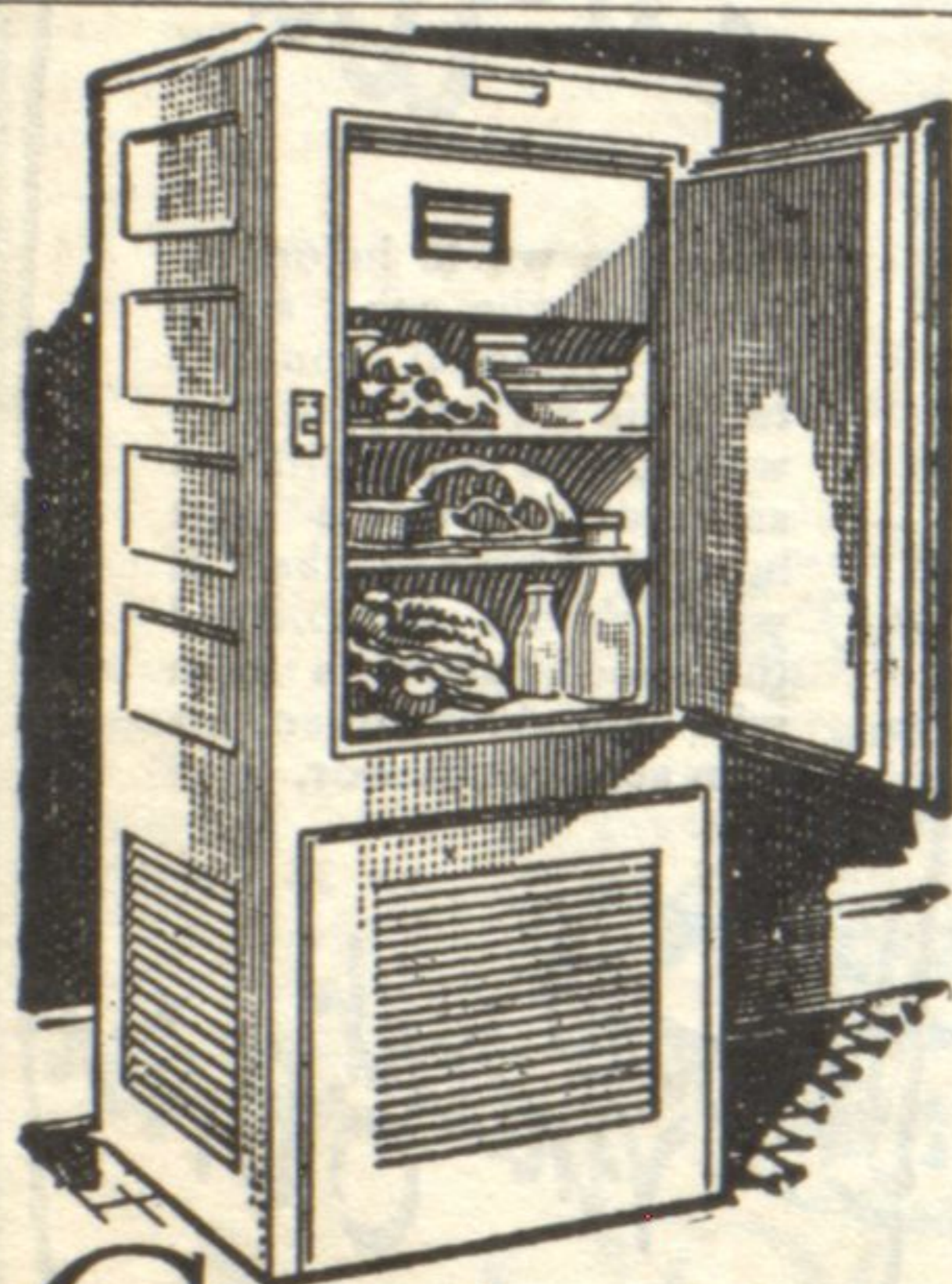


Central Cafeteria Ready to Welcome Guests December 1
