Chicago to Witness World Premiere of New Work: "Der Rosenkavalier This Sunday

The new week, the sixth, of the Chicago Civic Opera season, opens Sunday, December 6, with a matinee performance of "Der Rosenkavalier." Thousands of persons who have been anxious to hear this great German work, have been turned away because hitherto it has been sung on occasions when the subscription sale has absorbed every seat in the Chicago auditorium.

Therefore, the presentation of this novelty is a great triumph for the commuters who constitute the Sunday afternoon audience at the Chicago auditorium. The original cast will sing the opera—probably for the last time this season—and the walls of the house probably will be unable to accommodate the crowd that will wish to hear this unique work.

The current week will be brought to a close this Saturday with a performance of "Martha," at popular prices, in which Florence Macbeth, Irene Pavloska, the unequalled Tito Schipa, Lazzari, Torti, and many other stars of the first order in the Chicago

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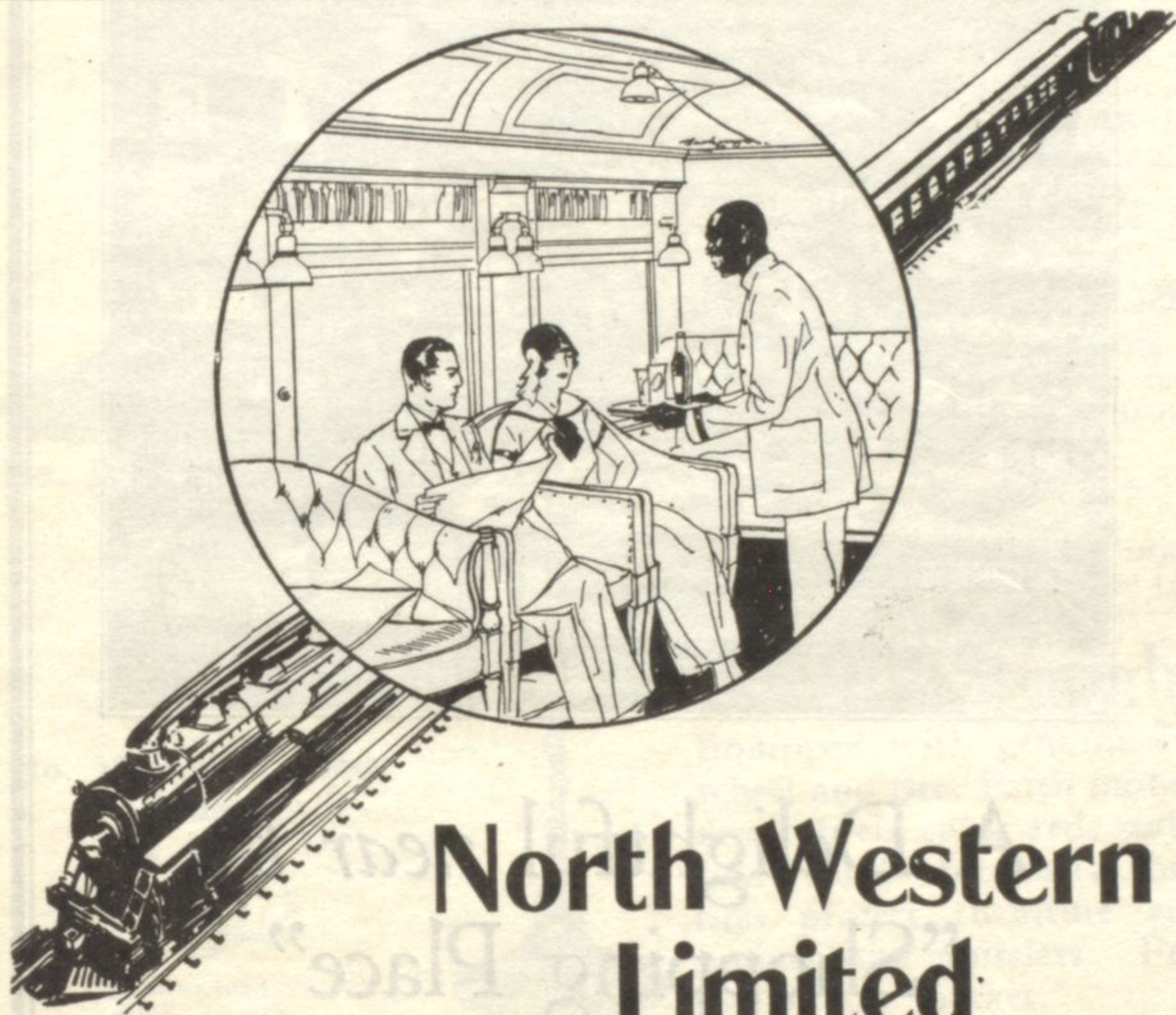
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
