Village to Make Check of Milk Supply Sources

Plans to cooperate with Chicago in its fight against distribution of milk from tubercular cows were formulated at the last meeting of the village council when members voted to ask dairies supplying milk in the village to furnish a statement telling from what state and county the milk has been obtained. Trustee B. F. Langworthy who is interested in Dr. Herman N. Bundeson's pure milk fight in Chicago, has kept the matter before the Village council with the result that a milk ordinance patterned after the model ordinance offered by the state board of health is now being drawn up, in addition to the action taken at the last meeting.

Offer Police Escort on Money Transfer Trips

To eliminate the possibility of a hold-up in the village Chief W. M. Peterson has offered to supply any merchant transferring large sums of money with a police escort. This offer is open to all merchants in the village and was contained in a letter sent to the Winnetka Chamber of Commerce recently.
