

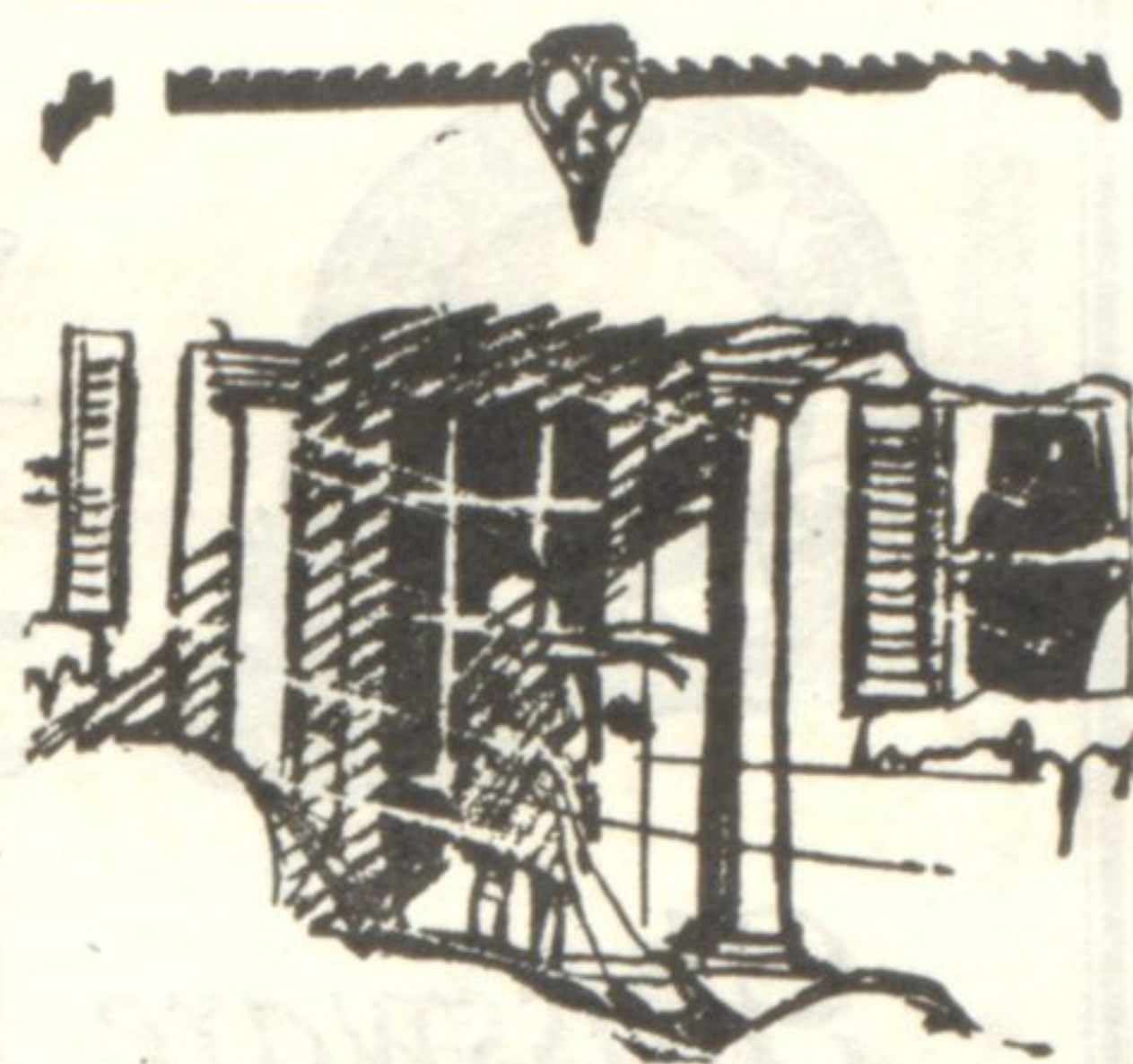
### Camp Fire's Sale Swells Treasury for Girls' Group
