

College Leader to Present Xmas Radio Talk Next Monday

The child's participation in Christmas, will be the subject of a radio talk to mothers, given by Miss Edna Dean Baker, president of the National Kindergarten and Elementary college, Monday afternoon, December 21. The talk is one of a series on child training which is being given under the direction of the college between 4 and 4:30 o'clock on the third Monday of each month, from the Daily News radio station, WMAQ.

A musical accompaniment has been arranged, and will be played by Francis M. Arnold, and the program will also include Christmas carols by students of the college.

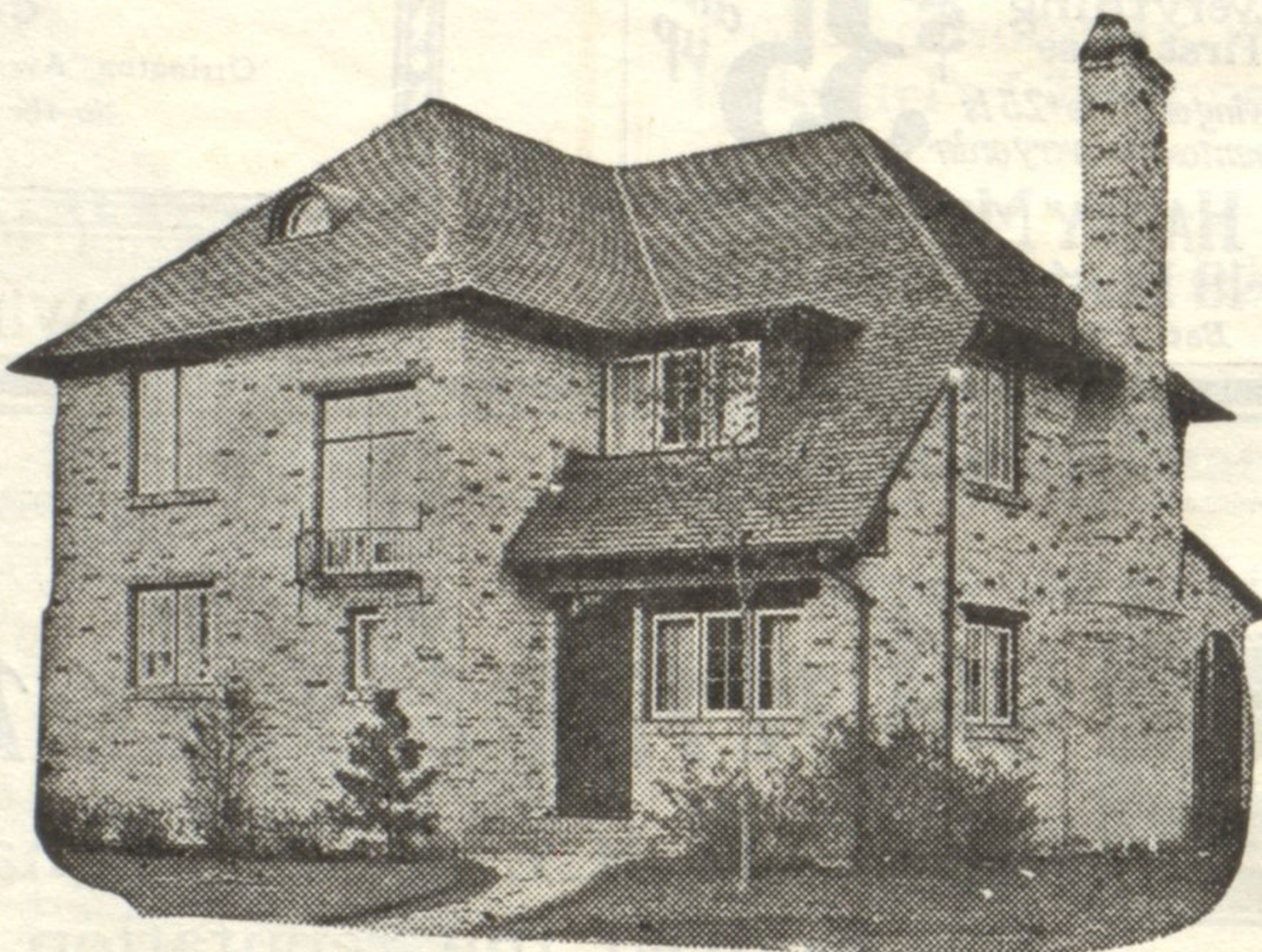

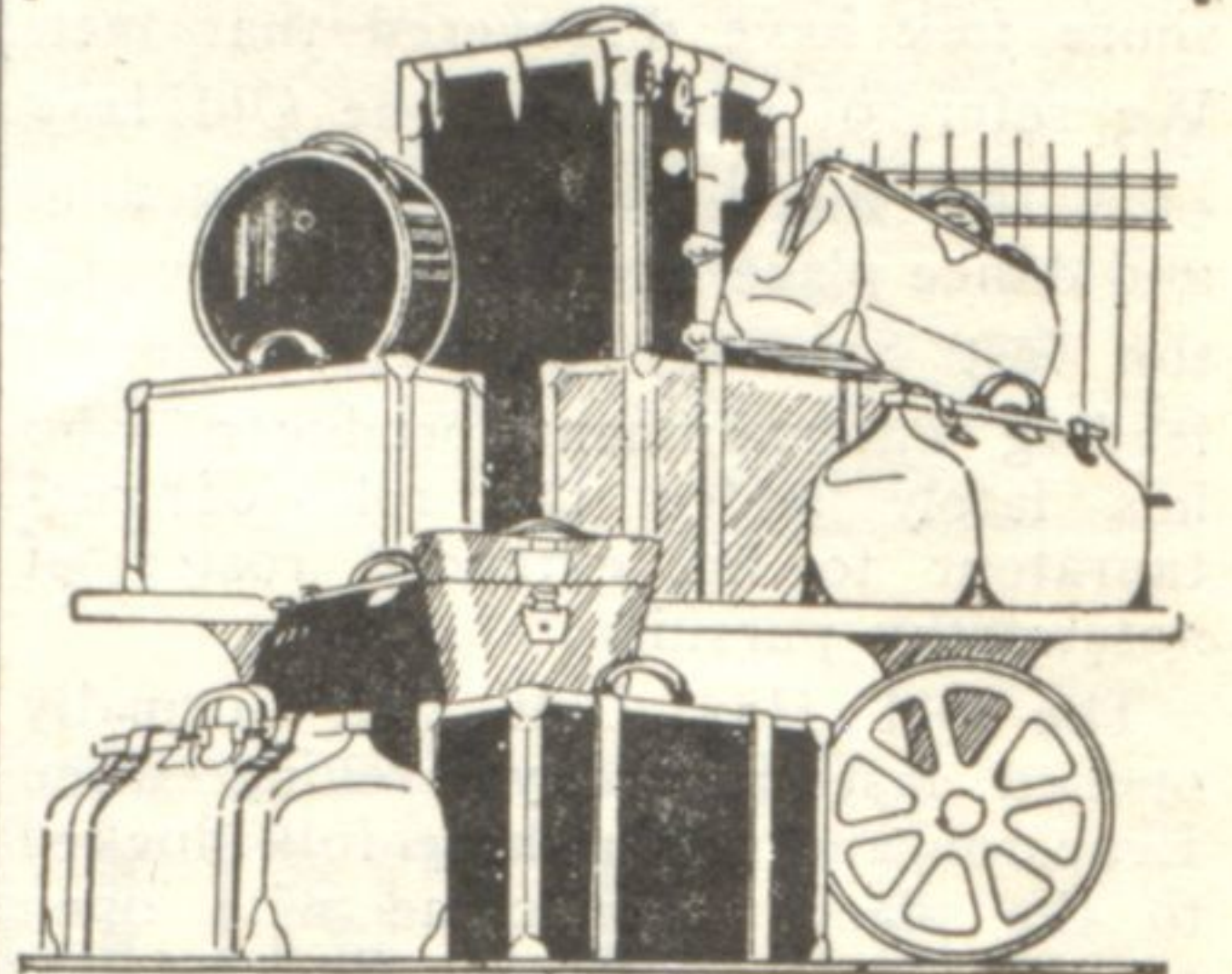
