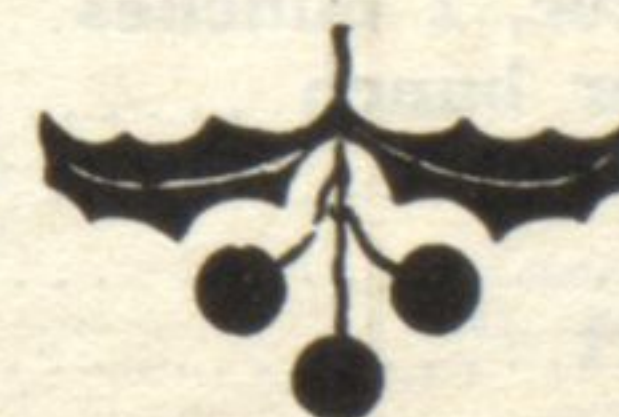
Santa Claus is in Wilmette
