

### Announce Plan to Establish Course in "Recreation"

A school of a national character to train recreation leaders will be established by the Playground and Recreation Association of America in the near future, according to an announcement by Joseph Lee, president of the association. The new school will give graduate courses of one year's duration primarily for the training of the 16,000 employed workers and the 4,000 volunteers now in public recreation work in the United States and Canada. The institution will also be open to persons who, for the first time, are seeking training as recreation directors.

The organization and administration of public recreation, including children's playground activities, community centers, athletic fields, stadiums, community music, community drama, nature study, handicraft, home play, church recreation, and the relationship of recreation to health, safety, delinquency prevention and character building, will comprise the major subjects of study in the new school.

The exact location of the school is still under consideration.

Winnetka Community House officials are interested in the venture.
