## VILLAGE THEATRE

Two of the best pictures of the year are coming to the Village theatre next week. They are "The Unholy Three" with Lon Chaney, and "Shore Leave", with Richard Barthelmess.

"The Unholy Three" will be shown Monday and Tuesday, December 28 and 29. This picture would come pretty close to victory in a race for the title of "best picture of the year."
