"This interest is figured on the amount of the current installment from January 2 a year ago to the date when payment is made. For instance, if payment is made on January 15, 1926, the interest should be figured on 121/2 months, and added to the amounts shown on the special assessment bill.

"This interest item could not be shown on the bills when rendered, because the Village Collector has no knowledge of the time when property owners expect to pay their assessments.

"Unless the interest on the current installment is computed and added to the bill and included in the remittance. the Village Office will be compelled to return the bill and check to the property owner for correction.
