### SUGGESTS PLANS FOR CENTENNIAL PROGRAM

Myron E. Adams, Winnetka Leader, Outlines Possibilities of Chicago Exposition

(Continued from last week)

"Without going into details there is one suggestion I would like to make with reference to the location of the Exhibition. On the present site of Grant Park, enlarged to its proposed size, there should be restored the original city of 1837, or one as nearly like it as possible in every respect. So that people coming from all parts of the world would have a chance to visualize the comparison between the city of 1837 and the city of 1937.

"Our own citizens, many of whom are unfamiliar with the efforts and struggles required in building this city, would appreciate better the city in which they live if they could see the contrast made possible by the efforts of its citizens. There is no better lesson in true Americanism than what people from all parts of the country and the world coming together in what was once the frontier of our country, have done by a common effort to

build such a city in the heart of America.

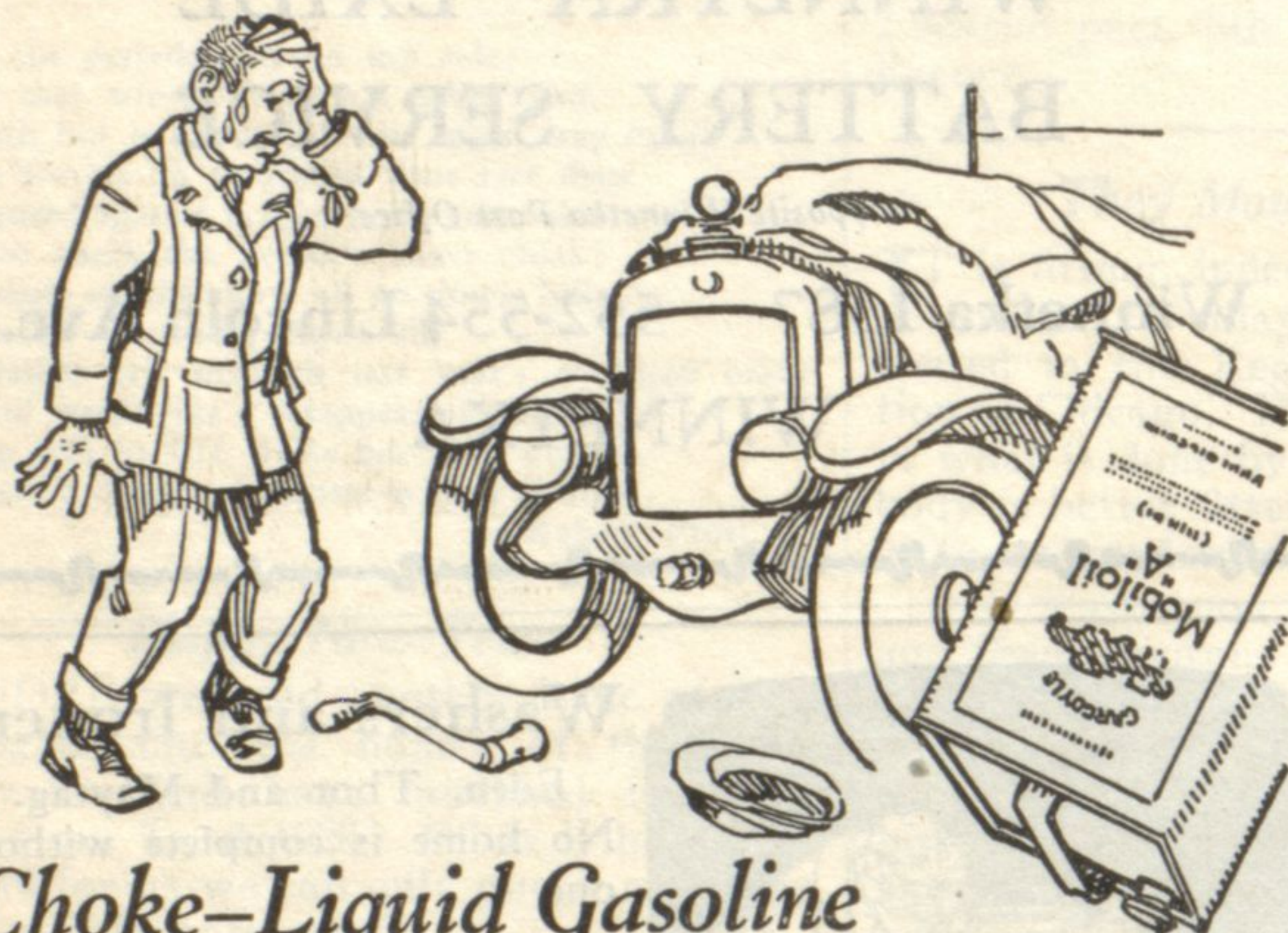
#### Appeal is Democratic

"In making the physical plans for the exhibition, this city will already have the Art Museum, the Field Museum, the Municipal Pier, the Stadium, the old Field Museum in Jackson Park, as a beginning, Chicago is the capitol city of both Transportation and Agriculture in this country. The Centennial would offer an opportunity to construct as permanent buildings, a Temple of Agriculture and of Transportation. These would remain as permanent centers for active service to the country.

"The real value of this movement is its influence upon the individual citizen. Its appeal is general and democratic. It will give to the individual a new goal to strike at. It will quicken ambitions and increase both the imagination and the energy and good will of patriotic citizens. It will keep older men and women more alert and active to retain the strength of their usefulness during the period. It will call out the adventuresome spirit of youth into public services that are interesting, colorful and worth while. It will be a rallying point where the diversified interests and different types of our citizens may unite in public service.

"Citizens with whom I have discussed this idea have been impressed with this value to the individual citizen as one of its most important factors. They believe that when this idea takes hold of its citizens, it will give a steady impulse of the development of the city.

"Chicago is a congregation of interests and of individuals. The object of this celebration would be to give these various interests and individuals a chance to improve the city as much as

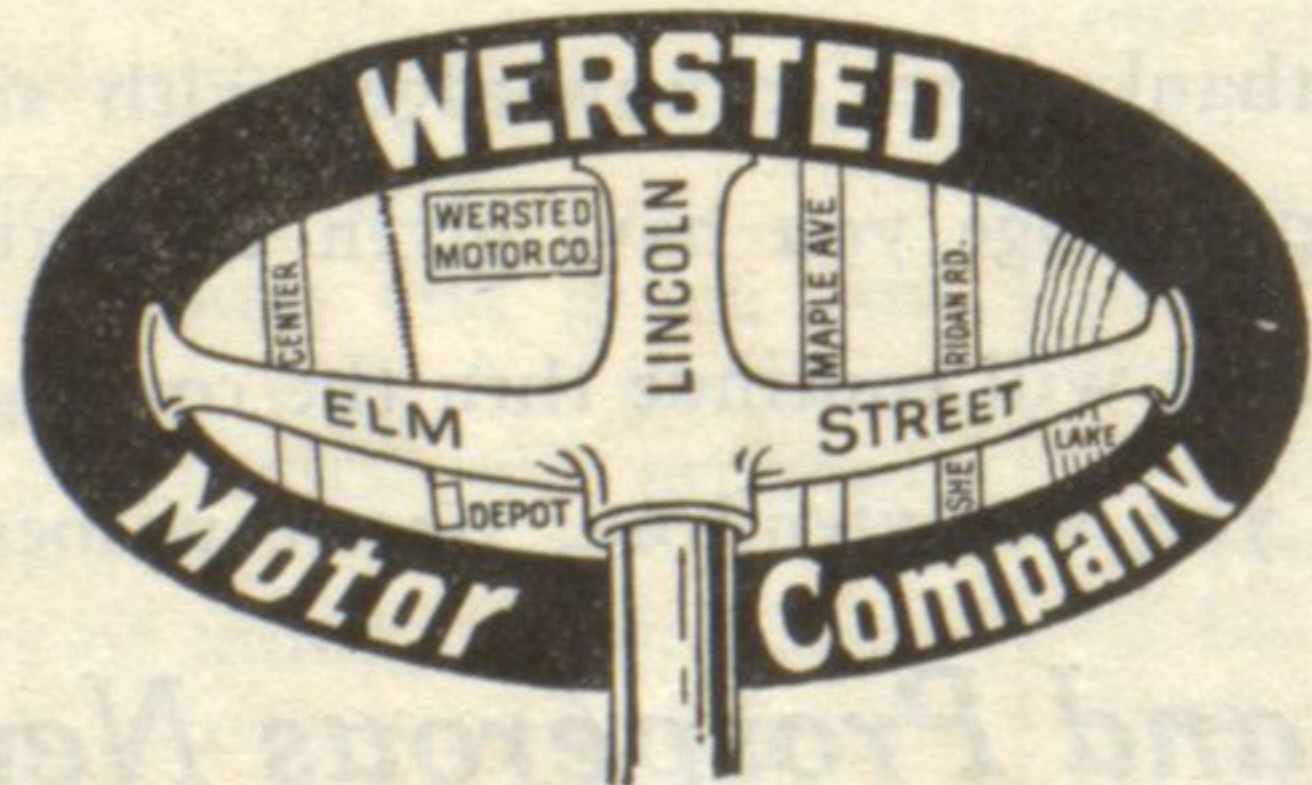
