Calls Government Social

"Women's training has always been social," said Mrs. Goode, "But government has always been social and therefore women should be in it." She declared that modern science has taken hold of most of the processes formerly carried on by women—sewing, baking, spinning, etc. Processes of this kind are now regulated in the city hall, in Springfield and in Washington instead of in the home.

Any women who thinks she can meet her responsibilities within the four walls of her home is mistaken, according to Mrs. Goode. The Voters league should make women realize this. Women must learn together, not alone. Clubs are provided so that women may learn the technique of the co-operative method.

Miss Elizabeth Gemmill, chairman of the committee on citizenship and election, was in charge of the meeting. Luncheon was served to 100 women and the business of the meeting carried through with despatch during the luncheon so that the speaking began promptly at 1:15 o'clock. Mrs. Walter Benson, president of the league, was in the chair.
