The telephone number at the new Village hall is **Winnetka 2500** and the departments reached by this number will be the general village offices, the water and light department, the public works department, the village service yard, the village attorney, the village clerk and the village manager. The police department number will remain **Winnetka 5** and the fire department number **Winnetka 0**.
