### County Administration Remains Within Budget

At a special meeting called before the Finance committee to hear a tabulated report made by Jacob Lindheimer, assistant to County treasurer, P. J. Carr, the statement was made that for the first time in the history of Cook county, under the direction of President Anton J. Cermak, the administration of Cook county affairs has been held within the budget regulations and due to economies, efficiencies, etc., \$1,741,000 has been recorded on the credit side of the county achievements rather than carrying a debit into the next budget.

In round figures the story of the achievement is revealed in the follow-

Bills accrued to be paid and not carried into the next budget, \$886,000; Tax anticipation warrants retired,
