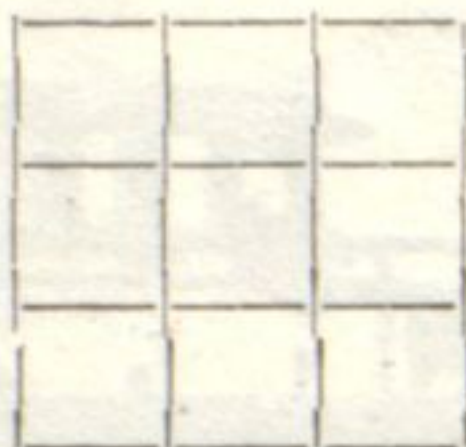

Rathbone Chosen to Direct House Fight at "Lame Ducks"

By special request, Henry R. Rathbone, congressman-at-large for Illinois, and a resident of Kenilworth, appeared before the committee on election of president, vice-president, and representatives in congress in favor of the proposed constitutional amendment, changing the time for the convening of congress and the inauguration of president.

Congressman Rathbone was selected to present the case in favor of the amendment, not only because he had introduced such a resolution in the last congress and is known to be much interested in the subject, but also because he is a recognized authority on the constitution of the United States and has been a lecturer on the subject in some of the law schools of Chicago and Washington, D. C.

The amendment provides for the convening of congress in January following the election in November, and not, as is now the case, in the following December, thirteen months after such election.

Among other things, Congressman Rathbone said, "Nothing could be more absurd than to allow a congress that had been repudiated at the polls to continue to legislate for many months thereafter. That is not the way we do in the business world. 'A lame duck' congress goes back to the days of the stagecoach when it took months to travel from one end of the country to another. The progress of modern science and invention has well-nigh annihilated time and distance, and we ought to keep the constitution abreast of the times. Our government should be responsive to the people's will."

Chicago Auto Show to Open This Saturday

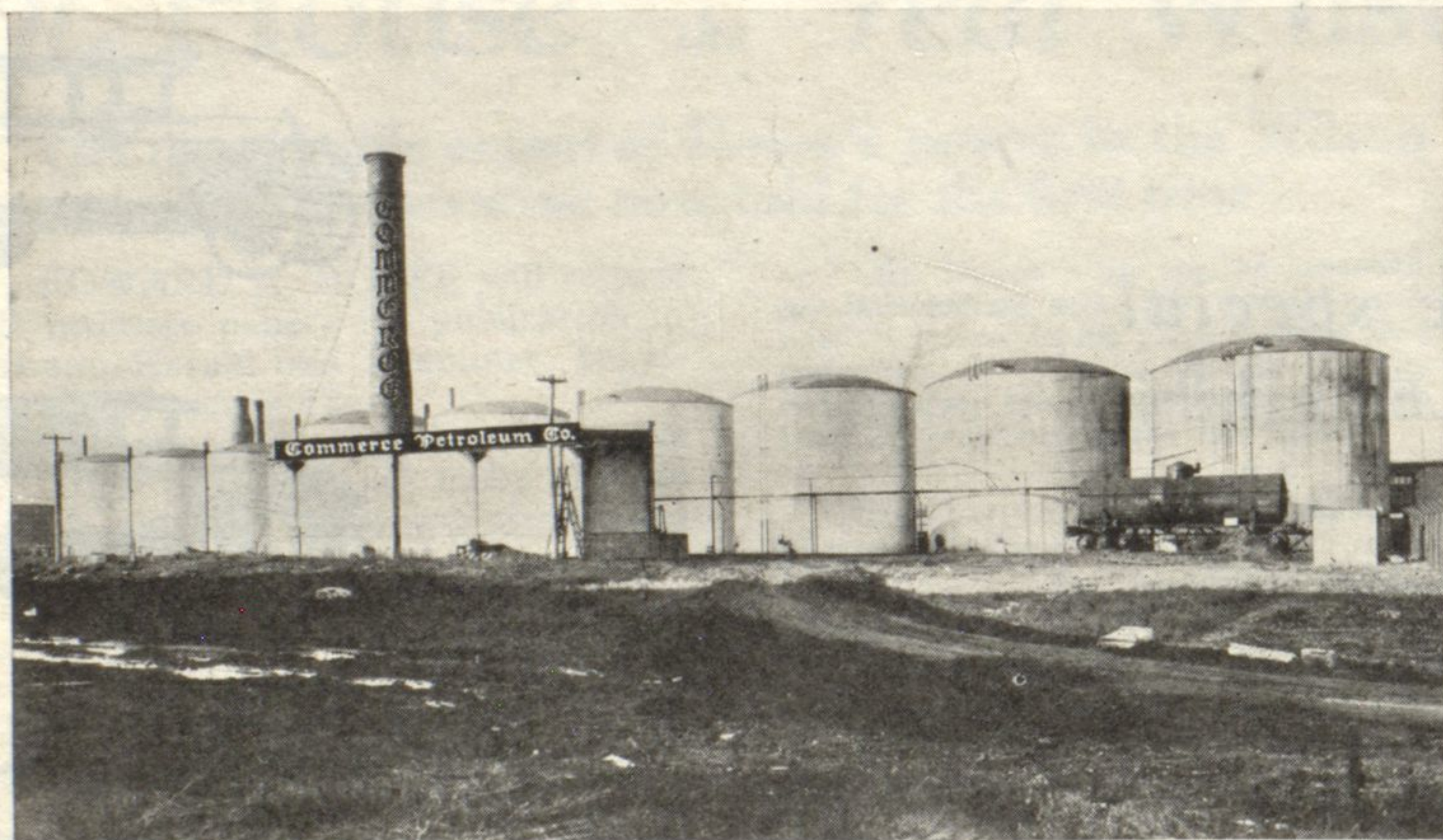
The eyes of the automobile world are now turned toward Chicago.

On Saturday afternoon, January 30, the doors of the Coliseum will swing open for the twenty-sixth annual National Automobile Show given under the auspices of the National Automobile Chamber of Commerce and the people of Chicago and other sections of the country will get their first view of the latest advancements and achievements in the fine art of passenger car and accessories manufacture. The show will continue until February 6.
