D., associate professor of Psychiatry at Johns Hopkins university. Her subject, "Child Behavior," was most interesting.

Miss Sara Place, superintendent of the Infant Welfare society of Chicago, and president of the Illinois State Nurses association, read a very fine report. She said there was 11 percent more work done with less than 3 percent in expenses during 1925. She reported that 12,847 babies under 2 years of age were cared for during the past year and the life rate was 98.7 percent for the year. This is only part of the work, as the prenatal and pre-school work were also very fine.
