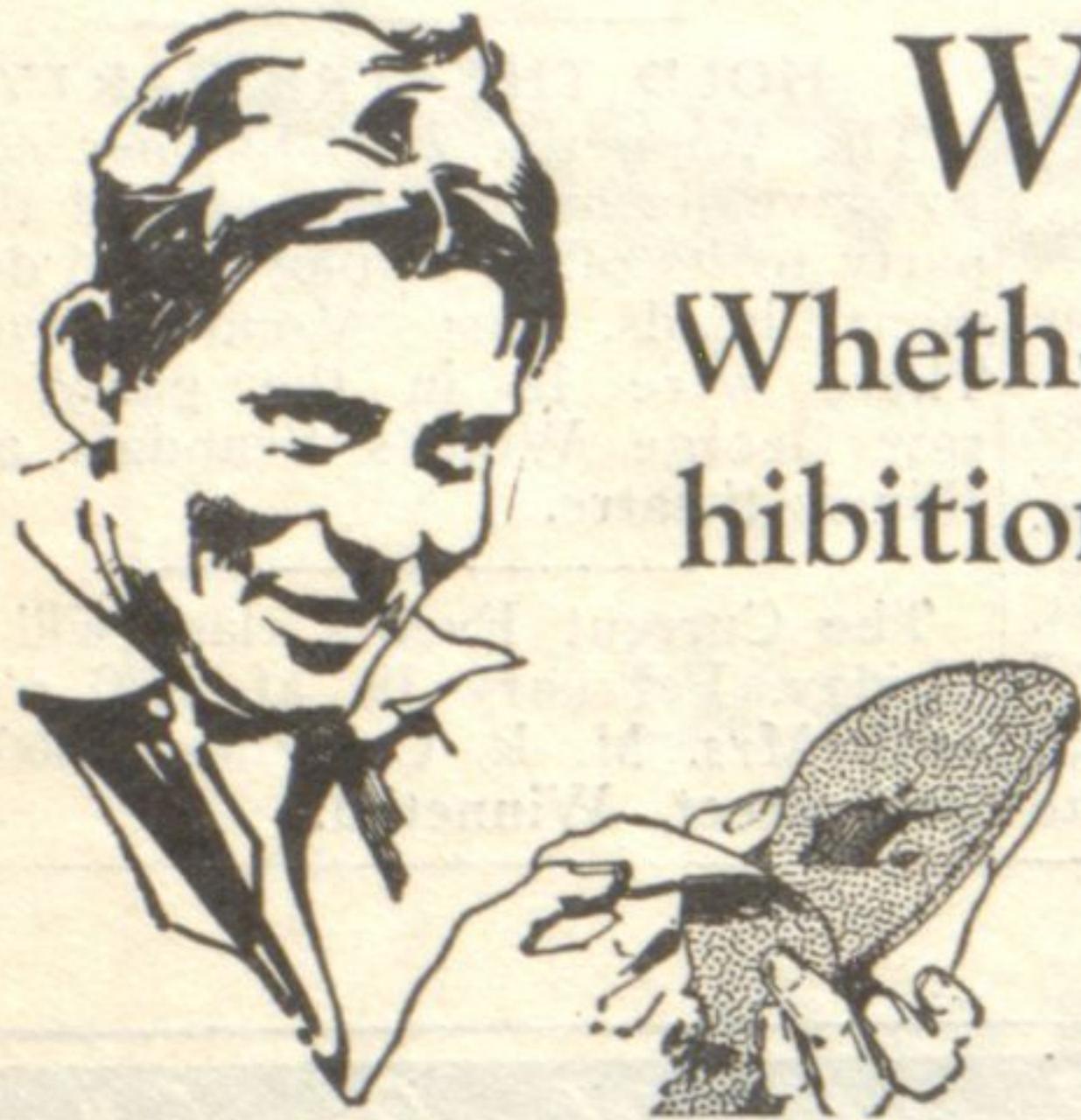


RESUMES ACTIVITIES

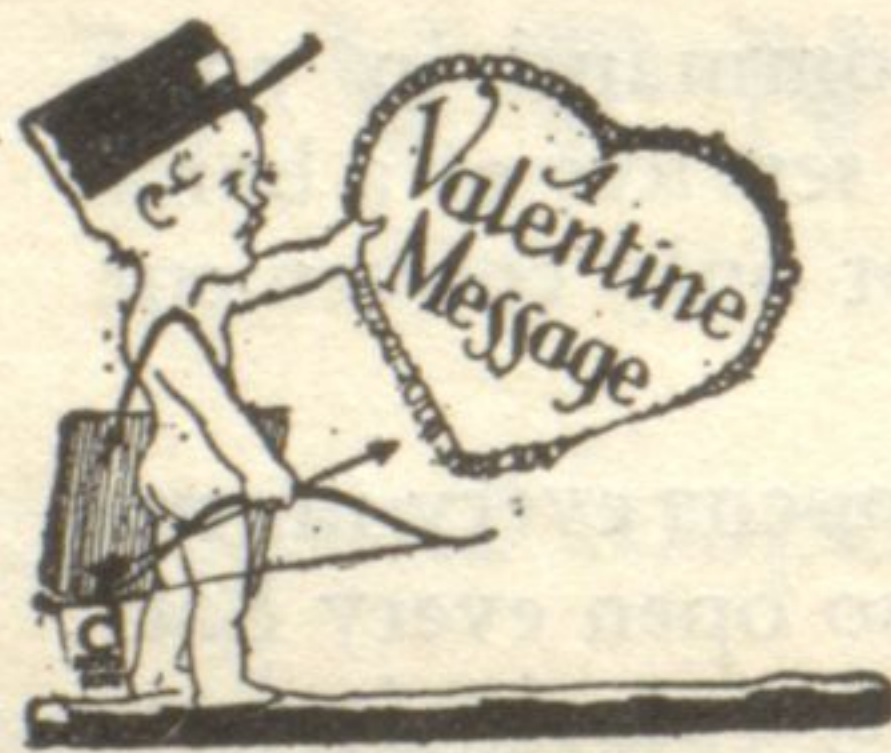

Mrs. William B.
