Discussion of Latin American Problems at Voters' Forum

A conference of interest to those interested in church and civic affairs takes place all day Saturday, February 13, in the Gold room of the Congress hotel, when a conference on "Our Relations with Latin America" will be held under the auspices of the Chicago League of Women Voters' Forum.

The speakers will be Prof. J. Fred Rippey, of the University of Chicago; Prof. Samuel Guy Inman, of Columbia university; Prof. Jacob Viner, of Chicago university; Prof. Jesse S. Reeves of University of Michigan; Prof. Quincy Wright, University of Chicago; and Walter Lichtenstein, of the First National bank, who will discuss "Investments in Latin America."

"Latin America," it is stated, "seems destined to be the center of the stage in world politics because of its great natural resources, its unoccupied territory, and unstable governments. Pan-Americanism is one of the great international problems for North America to face. The problems coming up at the next Pan-American conference need to be discussed now if public opinion is to have a share in their solution."

"Evolution" Is Lecture Topic at K. C. Meeting
