DASCH AGAIN PLEASES

Stormy Night Can't Keep North Shore Music Patrons From Symphony Program at New Trier Hall

It was a blizzard evening. But new Trier hall was again crowded to the walls with an enthusiastic audience of north shore music lovers. It was the fifth concert season of the New Trier Township orchestral association. It took place on Tuesday evening, February 9. George Dasch and his symphony players were in the best of artistic condition.

The first number presented to this appreciative congregation was the overture, "Fingal's Cave" by Mendelssohn, well known and melodious and deserving of its long life of 95 years, the original score being dated "Rome, 1830." The composition was inspired in Mendelssohn's brain by a visit to

the basaltic cavern on the island of Staffa, just off the coast of Scotland.

Following this very acceptable number came two movements from Beethoven's 7th symphony. It seems almost immodest to pass any remarks upon the work of this great composer. The writer can only say that he enjoyed the two movements. The playing of the artists on the platform was expressive and vital.

The closing selection in the first part of the program brought out the evening's soloist, William Beller, a pianist of very pleasing presence and unusual facility. He presented a Spanish Rhapsody for piano and orchestra by Liszt, the transcription being done by the noted pianist, Ferruccio Busoni. The composition demanded extraordinary technical ability, and the pianist met the demand in full. One of his most appreciated traits was the flexibility and fluency of his playing. Two encores were enthusiastically received.

The second half of the program comprised a serenade by Leo Weiner and two productions by Tschaiakowsky, including the celebrated Marche Slave. The next concert will take place on Tuesday, March 23.
