

Announce Three Day Chicago Conference on Parent Education

Mrs. Harold Ickes and Mrs. Edward Loewenthal are vice chairmen of the Chicago Association for Child Study and Parent Education which is arranging a conference of psychologists, psychiatrists, teachers, and physicians, to convene March 3, 4, and 5, in the Red Lacquer room of the Palmer House. The purpose of the conference is to instruct fathers and mothers how to succeed in bringing up their children.

This association is made up of ten groups of parents in Chicago and on the north shore who meet regularly for the study of the problems of children. This conference is the first of its kind to be held in this part of the country. It will parallel in some ways, it is stated, the pioneer national conference held in New York under the auspices of the National Child Study association, with which the Chicago group is affiliated.

Grace Abbott, head of the Children's bureau at Washington, Ernest Groves, professor of sociology at Boston university, Prof. Ralton Mayo, Prof. Patty Smith Hill, Columbia university, Dr. Arnold Gessel of the Yale psychoclinic, and Edna Noble White of the Merrill Palmer school of Detroit, will all take in the conference.
