The Playwriting class, a joint project of the Northwestern University School of Speech and the Drama Club of Evanston, is offering a prize scholarship of ten lessons for the best play to be contributed by March 17. Anyone on the north shore who is interested in playwriting, is eligible, to send in a play, it is announced, and any type or length of play will be accepted. The manuscripts, unsigned and accompanied by the author's name in a sealed envelope, are to be sent to Mrs. Carlos Andrews, 102 Keeney street, Evanston.

The three persons who will judge the plays will be: Theodore B. Hinckley, who has conducted the class for the past three years, and who also has been teaching classes in contemporary drama and playwriting at Northwestern university, and editor of The Drama magazine; Alexander Dean, director of the Playshop of Northwestern university, and director of the North Shore Theatre Guild; and Mrs. Carlos Andrews, who for several years has been chairman of the playwrighting class committee.
