New Trier Wins Prep Swim Meet in Home Waters

By placing first in nearly every event, swimmers representing New Trier High school Saturday night won the annual Cook county interscholastic meet held in the winner's pool. New Trier piled up a total of 66 points, while Lane Tech., their closest rival, found it difficult to collect 18. Maine township finished third with 17.

It was mainly through the untiring efforts of Lawrence Davis, who swam to high point honors in the events, that the New Trier natators were able to pile up such an overwhelming score. Davis won firsts in both the 40 yard breast stroke and the 100 yard free style events, and was a member of the victorious medley and 160 yard relay teams which gave him 12½ points.

The points won in the tourney by each school were as follows: New Trier, 66; Lane Tech, 18; Maine township, 17; Evanston, 7; Proviso, 1; Harrison, 1; Morton, 0; Englewood, 0.
