

Board Ponders Wilson Street Widening Plan

Many residents of the Indian Hill section attended a meeting held by the Board of Local Improvements last Tuesday evening to consider the question of widening Wilson street and Winnetka avenue in the vicinity of the Indian Hill station and the business block. No action was taken at the meeting, the matter being held over until the next meeting of the village council, April 20. Special assessment proceedings for this project have been instituted, following a request for the street widening by the Indian Hill Improvement association. It was the contention of this body that the narrow pavement at the intersection of Wilson street and Winnetka avenue created a dangerous condition. Various opinions as to the wisdom of widening the streets were voiced at the meeting. It was suggested that property owners of the vicinity attempt to work out a suitable plan.

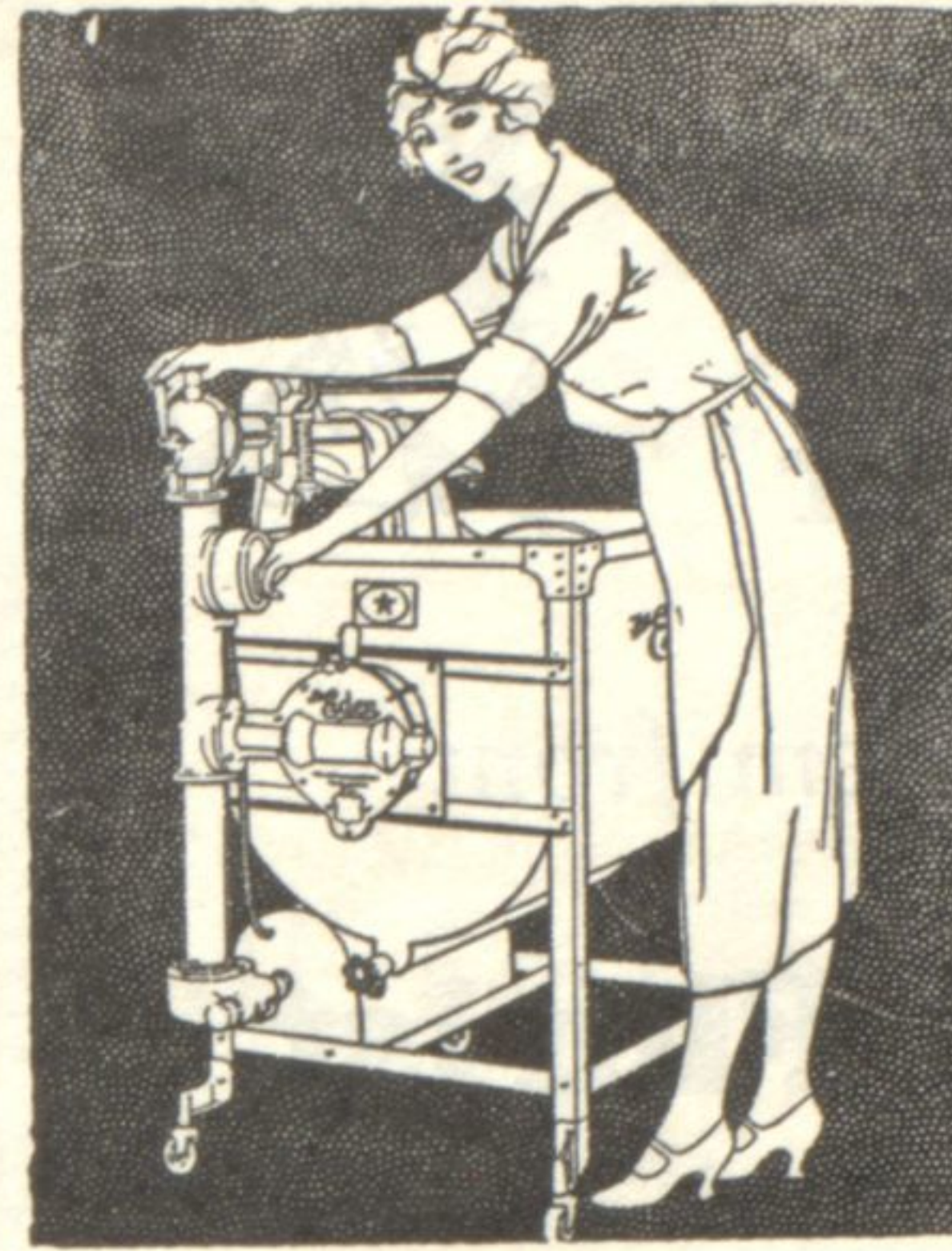
