John F. Devine Republican Candidate for County Treasurer

John F. Devine, Republican candidate for county treasurer, has served the people of Cook County for the last seven and one-half years



as Clerk of the Probate Court. In that capacity he earned more than half a million dollars over and above all expenses of his office. This profit has meant a corresponding decrease in taxation for the people of Cook County.

Proved fitness means assured profits. John F. Devine is an asset to the people of Cook County, and his present value of them should be increased still more by making him County Treasurer.

"Reality" was the subject of the lesson sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, Sunday, March 28.

Also a corresponding passage from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy: "Mortals must gravitate Godward, their affections and aims grow spiritual,—they must near the broader interpretations of being, and gain some proper sense of the infinite,—in order that sin and mortality may be put off" (p. 265).
