Two Seriously Hurt in Highway Car Collision

An automobile accident resulting in serious injury to occupants of both cars occurred on Waukegan road, Tuesday morning about 10 o'clock, when the Dodge sedan driven by Sam and Dave Bloom, of Chicago collided with a Buick coupe occupied by Martin Jocz and wife and their nephew, of Milwaukee.

The accident occurred about a block north of the Techny bridge. Both cars were wrecked by the impact and Mr. Jocz suffered a fractured skull and Dave Bloom a fractured rib, with serious cuts on his arm and face. The other occupants of the cars escaped with minor injuries.

The injured ones were taken to the Highland Park hospital by R. Lauer, president of the Village board of Northbrook and W. H. Kable, chief of police of that village, who were among those who went to the relief of the accident victims.

CHICAGO SUNDAY TRIBUNE, Sept. 6, 1914

Adam Wolf, born in Germany, 1857, came to Chicago 1864. As a west town collector in 1893 he voluntarily turned over to the town board the interest money earned by public funds. In 1892 he was elected west town collector. Elected City Treasurer in 1895. Three years later he became county assessor and was reelected in 1902 and 1908.
