Mrs. Eva G. Noyes Is Taken by Death Here

Mrs. Eva G. Noyes, mother of Mrs. F. H. Skinner, of 444 Elder lane, died Saturday night at about 11 o'clock, at the home of her son, John Noyes, in Beloit, Wis., where she had gone for a visit. Mrs. Noyes had been ill only a week, suffering from an attack of influenza, and was confined to her bed only three days. Funeral services were conducted from the residence of Dr. and Mrs. F. H. Skinner, Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock, by the Rev. James Austin Richards, of the Winnetka Congregational church. Burial was at Graceland cemetery. Mrs. Noyes was 74 years of age, last March 22. Her home formerly was at Janesville, Wis., but for more than a year past she had been living with her daughter, in Winnetka. Her husband preceded her in death several years ago. One other son, Ned, of Chicago, survives.

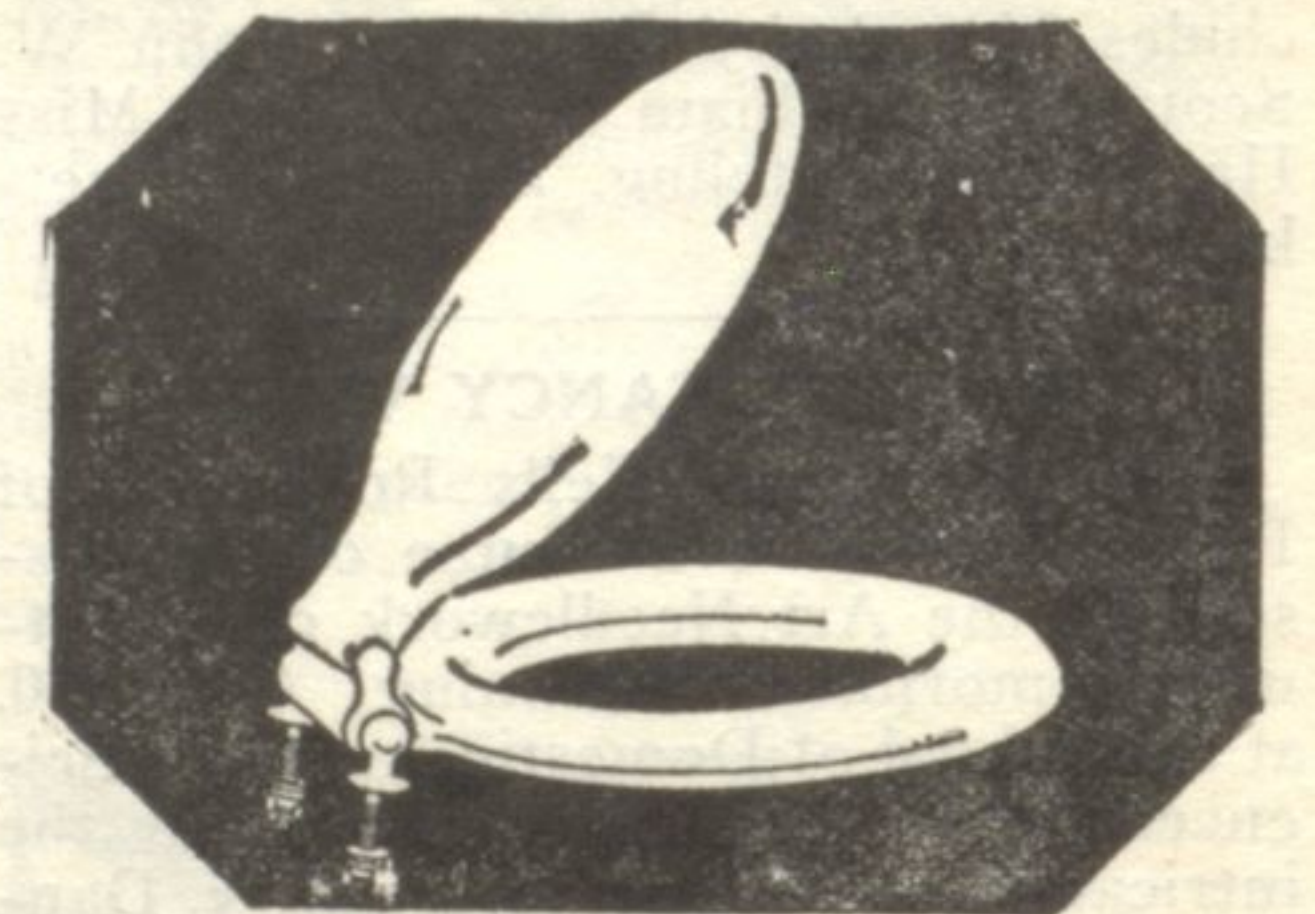
