Village Marshal Not Known to Cops; Jailed

Theodore Flynn, reelected Village Marshal on Tuesday, April 6, came to grief with the police department, of which he is theoretically in charge, less than a week after his victory at the polls. The grief was due to a mistake in identity. Flynn, accompanied by his brother Thomas, was about to enter his restaurant at 564 Center street late last Monday night when the two were seen by Policeman John Clark. He had been detailed to watch the district carefully as thieves had made an attempt to enter a nearby store. Clark sought to question Flynn but the latter became angry, it was said, and a fight started. Clark finally subdued Flynn and his brother, after a passing motorist had come to his help, and took them to the police station. After explanations were made the two were released. No charges have been filed, it was said late this week.

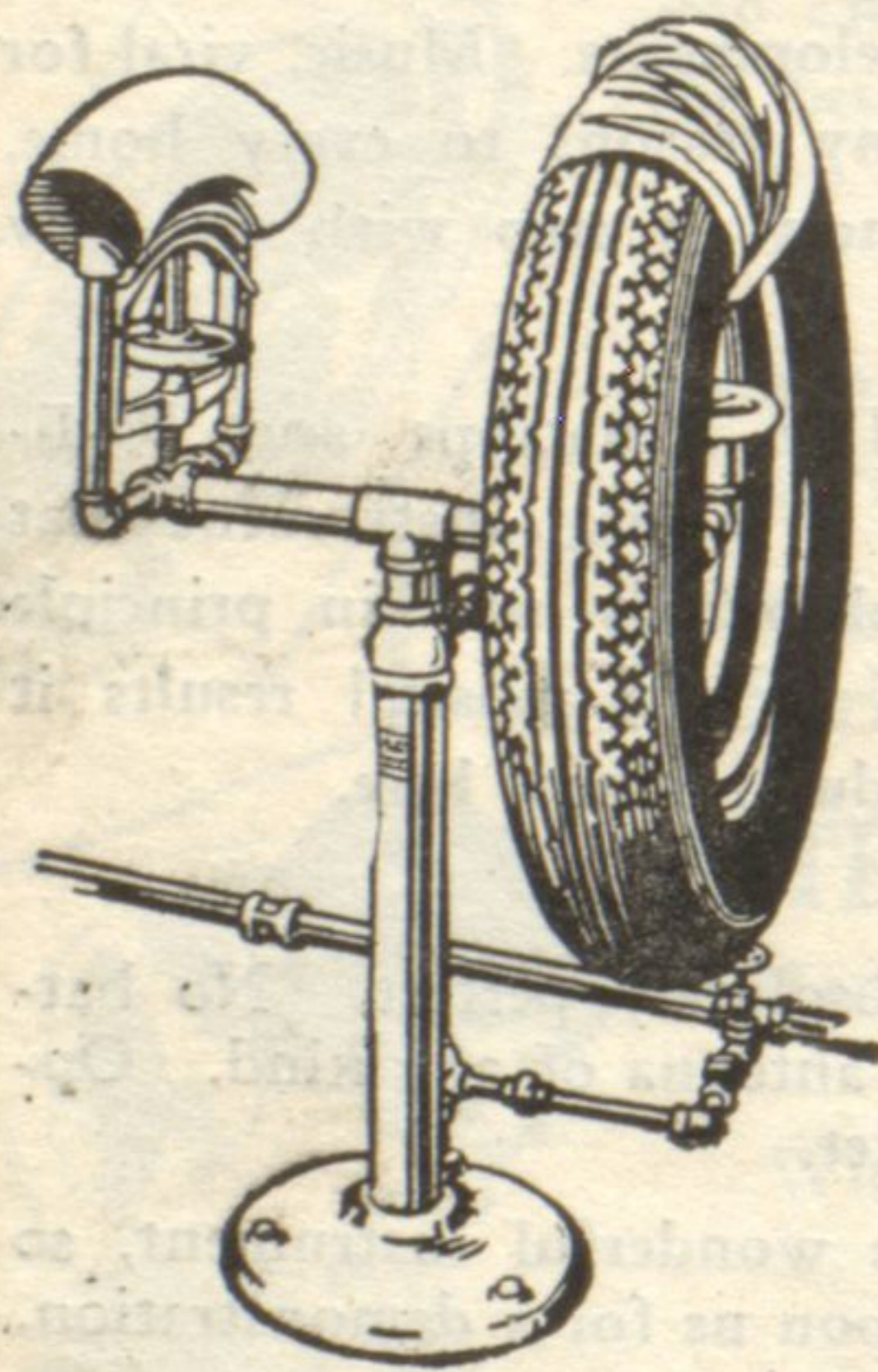
