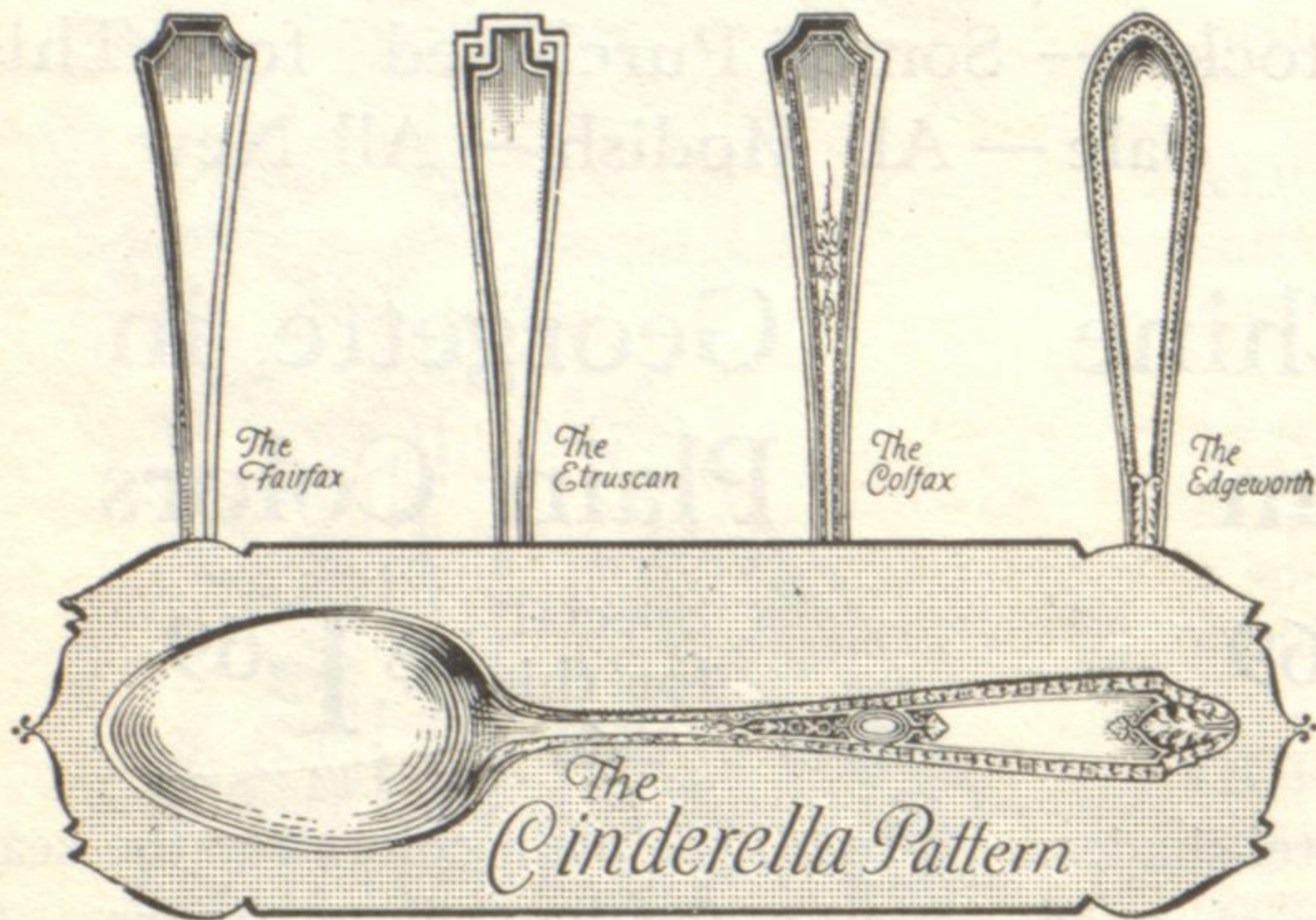

"This little organization has spread not only to other cities of this nation, but to those of other nations," he said. "When we remember that Art Smith of the Air Mail and E. P. Lett of the National Air Transport, Inc., got their start in aviation through rubber-motored aircraft over 10 years ago, we know that these M. A. F. tournaments are more than mere child's play.

"The first tournament, in 1923, had 75 contestants. In 1924 there were 150 fliers with 225 aircraft. And last year (1925) there were approximately 350 fliers with nearly 500 aircraft at the Pier."

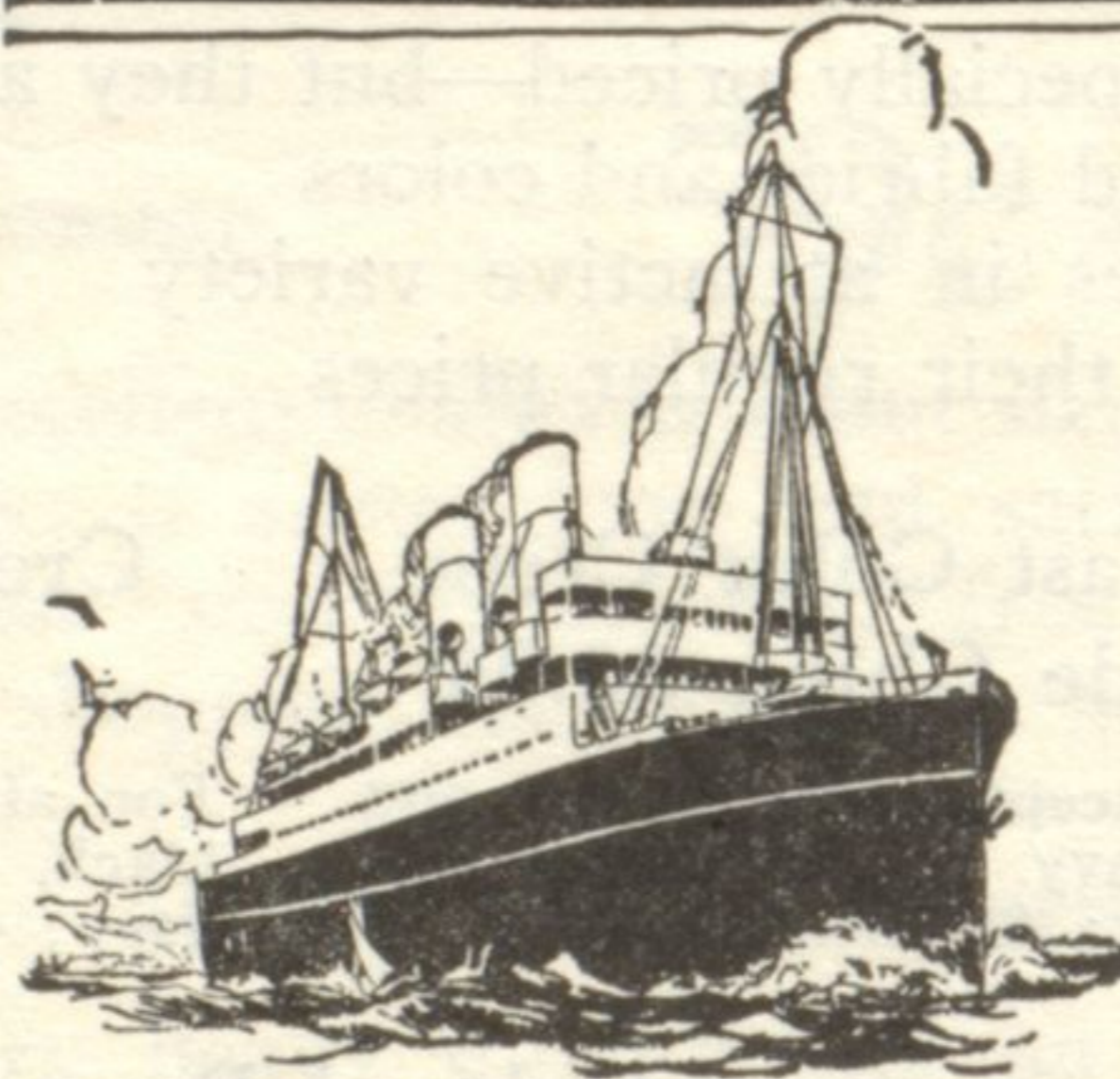
