



The local chapter of the Red Cross supervises the work, supplies the equipment and issues certificates upon the completion of the course.

> Boys, as well as girls, are often enrolled in this course. This year it has been given in the parochial schools to pupils of the seventh and eighth grades. More than 4,000 children have earned the certificates awarded jointly by the American National Red Cross and the Bureau of Child Welfare, Department of Health, Chicago.
