### At the Woman's Club

"Had it not been for women, three fourths of all the finest music in the world would not have been written." Such was the opening sentence of the talk given by Felix Boroski, well known critic, at the annual meeting of the Winnetka Woman's club last Tuesday. Mr. Boroski went on to say that this influence of women was felt in four directions, namely, 1, the inspiration women have given to composers; 2, the practical assistance women have given to composers, copying manuscripts, etc; 3, as musical interpreters; 4, as creators of music.

The inspiration of women was most generously felt in the twelfth and thirteenth centuries, the age of Charity, when the troubadors roamed Europe, glorifying all women in song for

the love of one.

With the advent of professional composers, the influence of individual women was felt on the work of the composers. Most of the greatest pieces of work of practically all the great composers, Beethoven, Schubert, Wagner, Brahms, can be traced to the inspiration of some woman. This inspiration to composers has been perhaps, woman's greatest contribution to music.
