Children Feature Big Music Festival in May

Long before orchestral concerts for children became general in this country the Chicago North Shore Festival association had laid down a settled policy that music for and by the young folk should be a definite and permanent feature of its concerts. The first festival that was given at Evanston—it was in 1909—brought forward a chorus of 1,000 children's voices and this attractive item in the scheme of art has reappeared ever since with many north shore children in the group. The Young People's matinee will be held this season in the Northwestern university gymnasium, May 29. A young violinist of exceptional artistry—Miss Sylvia Lent, a pupil of the great Auer—will play the finale from Mendelssohn's concerto and the Introduction and Rondo Capriccioso by Saint-Saens and the children will sing groups of songs as well as a cantata "The Ugly Duckling" by Granville English. Mr. English is a Chicago composer who, having studied composition with Felix Borowski, made considerable success as a song composer.
