**Rubbish Fires Lead in
Chief Houren's Records**

The Winnetka Fire department was called to the office of the Scully Transfer company, in the Prouty Annex, Thursday afternoon, by a small blaze which developed in some inexplicable manner in an awning. The damage was small, only about \$20.

Chief G. M. Houren and his men, in addition to the Scully fire, have responded to nine calls since April 30, all of which were rubbish fires and only three of which resulted in any damage.

On April 30, a garage at 1030 Hubbard lane, at the residence of George B. Calkins, was damaged about \$20, and on the same date the department was called to the Jackson residence, 391 Provident avenue to extinguish a fire of spontaneous combustion origin, in some rubbish in the basement.

A fire on May 1, spreading from some burning rubbish, damaged the garage at the residence of Mrs. Julius Eckhart, to the extent of about \$50.
