

Congestion and Accidents Cause Big Waste Yearly

Annual losses owing to traffic accidents, congestion, and lack of improvements in highway facilities constitute widespread economic wastes which reach every individual, according to the Chicago Motor club.

In a statement issued this week the club pointed out that a committee studying the traffic problem for the National Conference on Street and High-

way Safety estimated that the loss from death, personal injuries, and destruction of property in traffic accidents amounts to \$600,000,000 annually. In addition losses from congestion, extra distances traveled as the result of inadequate traffic facilities, increased maintenance and operating costs of vehicles caused by improper road surfaces, excessive grades, time lost at grade crossings and draw bridges, and other causes bring the annual loss to an estimated amount of \$20 per capita on the entire population of the United States or a total of more than two billion dollars per annum.
