#### Local Boy Scouts to Greet Founder in Chicago May 8

Boy Scouts of the north shore, with Scouts from Chicago and other towns of the states of Illinois, Indiana, Michigan and Wisconsin, which comprise the Seventh region, ten thousand in all, will rally in honor of the "Chief Scout of the World," Lieutenant-General Sir Robert S. S. Baden-Powell, of London, at 3 o'clock. Saturday afternoon, May 8, at Dexter Park Pavilion in Chicago.

Baden-Powell, the founder of the British Boy Scout association and the Boy Scout movement, will visit Chicago Friday and Saturday. He is now on a short tour of the United States following his participation in the sixteenth annual meeting of the National Council, Boy Scouts of America, held in Washington, April 30 and May 1.

With General Leroy T. Stewart, Scout Commissioner of Chicago, as marshall, the rally program will be brief. But with ten thousand stalwart youngsters, in khaki uniforms, passing in review before their world leader, banners flying and the boys giving mass yells, the huge pavilion will present a remarkable spectacle. Patriotic music will be played by the Seascout band from Grand Rapids and the Joliet grade school band of 85 boys, every one a Scout. Sir Robert Baden-Powell will award Egale badges to thirty scouts who have attained the rank, the highest in Scoutdom, since March 1. He will also make a short talk.
