He denounced "pacifism at any price," and gave warning of such a movement.

The hearty applause which Mr. Lynch received at the conclusion of his stirring address, was indicative that the Legion, to a man, was with him.

Capt. J. M. Dickinson, Jr., Robert Elmer, Post Commander Edward R. Lewis, Lincoln Rogers, Frederick Mason, and Lloyd Hollister were among others who spoke on the subject. E. H. Allen also favored the cannons.

Captain Dickinson said there had been references to the attitude which the Gold Star mothers of Winnetka would take in the matter of having the cannons placed in public places, where frequent visions of them would call so vividly to their memory the great sac-

rifice which they have made in giving up their sons.

Captain Dickinson said he had talked with the Gold Star mothers of Winnetka and not one of them had raised an objection to the action of the Legion. One Gold Star mother he said, stated she would not object if a cannon was placed on every corner of the village.

"What Has Winnetka Done?"

"What has Winnetka really done to commemorate the memory of her Soldier Dead?" she asked.

At the conclusion of the discussion of the captured German war cannons, preparedness and pacifism, the meeting took on a less somber aspect with the introduction of J. Williams Macy, the well known amateur actor, of Winnetka, who sang the men back into a more jovial mood and sent them home happy. Miss McGiffan, accompanied Mr. Macy at the piano.
