

### AID ROAD BUILDING

**House Passes Federal Aid Legislation:  
Expect Prompt Favorable Action in Senate**

Motorists of the nation won their first outstanding victory in the campaign for continued Federal aid for highway construction when the House, without a dissenting vote, late Friday passed the Dowell Bill authorizing appropriations of \$75,000,000 annually for the fiscal years 1928 and 1929 for roads in the Federal aid system.

In addition to the Federal aid appropriations, the Dowell bill also carries appropriations of \$7,500,000 for each of the two fiscal years for forest roads and trails. The bill now goes to the Senate for consideration.

A telegram received this week by the Chicago Motor club stated that no amendments were offered to the bill and that it was debated but four hours on the floor of the House without a single objection being made to its passage. Action on the resolution permitting immediately consideration of the bill was unanimous, the telegram stated.

Charles M. Hayes, president of the Chicago Motor club, said this week that the records show complete unanimity since the bill was first introduced. He said that House leaders told representatives of the A. A. A. after the vote that the astounding success of the bill so far was owing to the thorough manner in which the organized motorists and others aiding in the campaign had sold eastern states on the national benefits accruing from Federal aid.

According to the telegram received from the American Automobile association headquarters the overwhelming success of the Federal aid bill in the House will doubtless have a strong effect on the Senate but it will in no way cause the nation-wide motoring organization to let down on its campaign.
