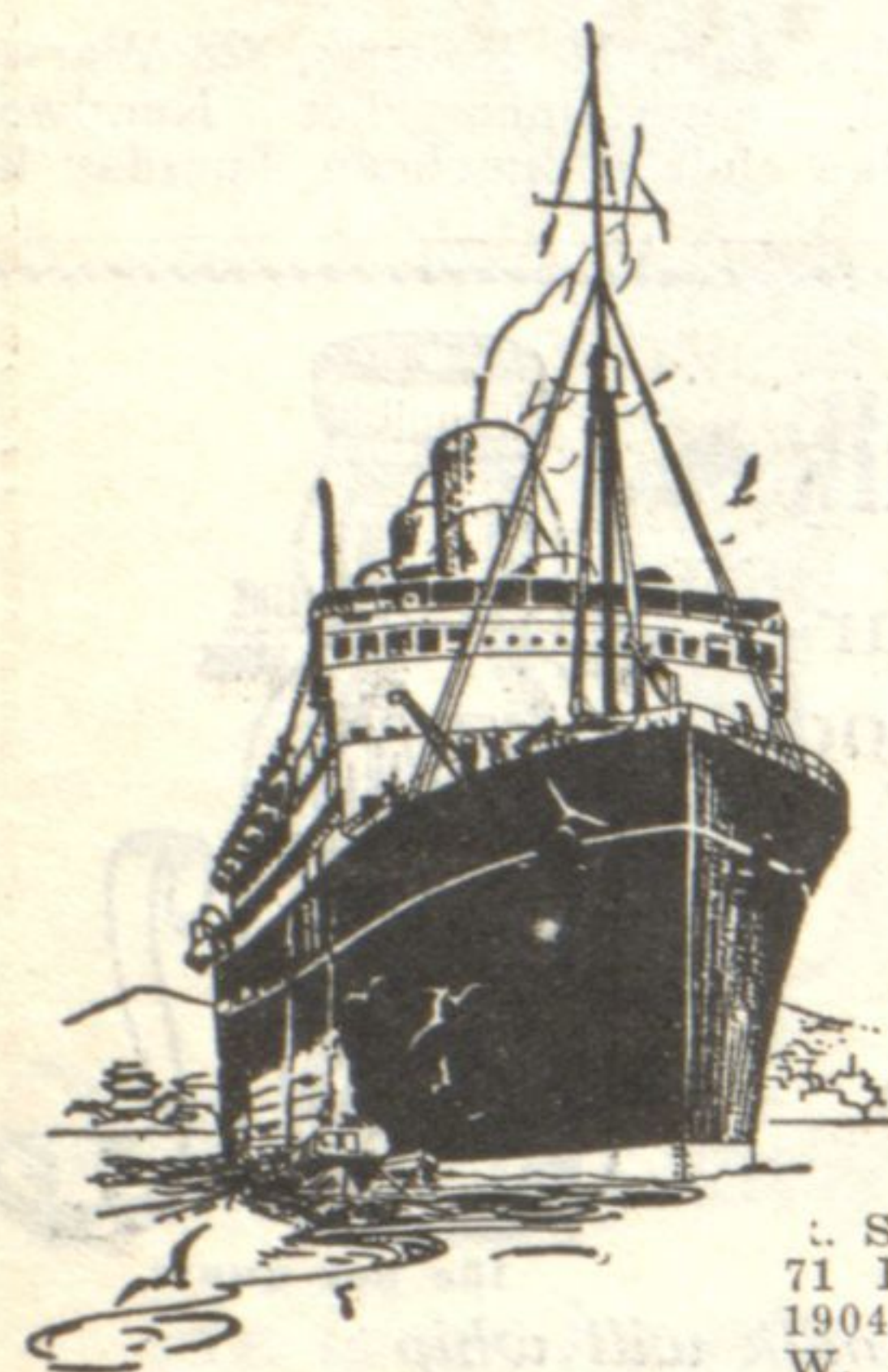

avenue; Lincoln avenue from south line of Tower road to north line of Humboldt avenue; Pine street from west line of Lincoln avenue to east line of Center street; Pine street from southerly line of Prospect avenue to westerly line of Sheridan road; Maple avenue from north line of Ash street to westerly line of Sheridan road; Walnut street from north line of Willow road to westerly line of Sheridan road; Ash street from east line of Linden street to westerly line of Sheridan road; Cherry street from east line of Linden street to westerly line of Sheridan road; Oak street from easterly line right-of-way C. & N. W. to westerly line of Sheridan road; Elm street from east line of Arbor Vitae road to westerly line of Sheridan road. In addition to the expenditure of \$5,500 as the Village's share of the cost of macadam resurfacing this year there will be spent approximately \$25,000 additional on maintenance of brick, asphalt and concrete streets and for cleaning, snow-plowing and other street maintenance. The total street cost of \$30,000 is about equal to the revenue from vehicle taxes and the road and bridge tax of the township.
