Greeley Pupils to Hold May Festival at School May 26

The May Festival at Greeley school, a review of the seasonal songs taken from the year's repertoire, will be held early Wednesday afternoon, May 26, on the playground at Greeley school.

Many of the songs lend themselves naturally to dramatization or characterization, since most of them are Folk songs or traditional melodies. When a song does that it is felt the corresponding action has been used either in playing or in enrythmics.

In the Primary department the children are using songs representing birds, bees, bunnies, caterpillars, butterflies, all living creatures of any small child's experience.

The older children have chosen dramatization chiefly. The four seasons are depicted with activities belonging to each:

- Autumn—leaves, dryads, wind.
- Winter—Jack Frost, snow.
- Spring—robins, bluebirds, bunnies, caterpillars, allegory of sunrise.
- Summer—bees, sheep, elves, sypsies.

ESTABLISH BANK FOR HUBBARD WOODS AREA

Ground to be Broken Next Week for New Financial House at 954 Linden Avenue

Hubbard Woods, one of the most rapidly growing sections on the entire north shore, is to have a new bank. The site has been purchased, a fifty foot frontage immediately south of the real estate office of Frank A. Reid at 954 Linden avenue. Ground will be broken next week and the structure rushed to an early completion, by the latter part of August or the first of September, it is said.

The building will be of brick, one story high and especially designed for the modern, up-to-date bank which it is to house.

Capitalized at \$50,000

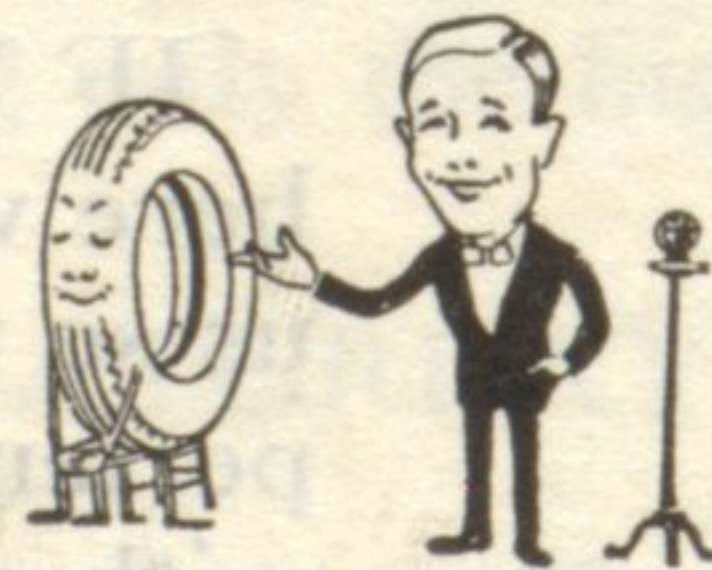
The name of the new bank will be the Hubbard Woods Trust and Savings bank, capitalized at \$50,000 and with a surplus of \$12,500. The stock has all been subscribed and the charter issued. The business activities on Linden avenue which have been so pronounced and continuous for the past several months is thus given its greatest impetus. Business vacant in this particular section of Hubbard Woods has more than trebled in value, in recent months, it is said. The sale of the lot on which the new bank is to be erected was negotiated through the real estate firm of Frank A. Reid.

The officers of the new bank will be announced later. Prominent among the men who are back of its organization are Markham B. Orde, August Ziesing, Walter J. McGuire and John Jeffrey, all of Glencoe and William T. Bacon, Calvin Fentress and F. E. Bartelme, of Winnetka.
