

Many Groups to Participate in Memorial Parade

Memorial Day exercises on Monday, May 31, will begin with the assembling at Community House at 9:30 a. m. of all the participating organizations. These organizations are the American Legion Post, Boy Scouts, Sea Scouts, Pathfinders, Camp Fire Girls, Girl Scouts, and school children. Thence the parade will move to the northwest corner of the Village Green.

The set program will begin on the Green at 10 o'clock. It will consist of numbers by the band, singing of patriotic airs by the entire assembly, address, and appropriate military ceremonies. The program will also contain the decoration of Memorial trees by the Camp Fire Girls, taps on the trumpets, singing of the national anthem after the raising of the flag, and will close with the benediction.

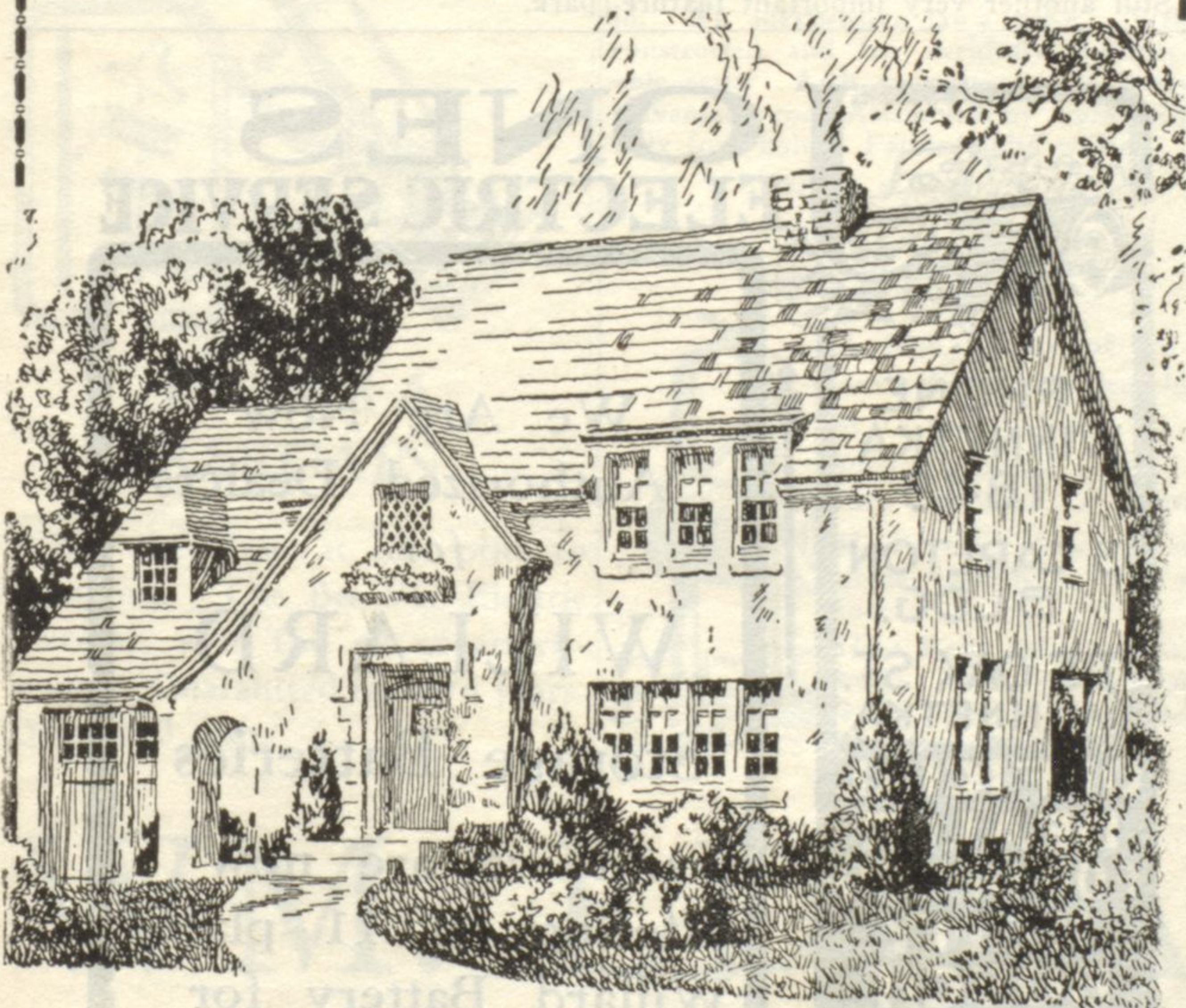
Improve Ventilation in Rudolph Matz Hall

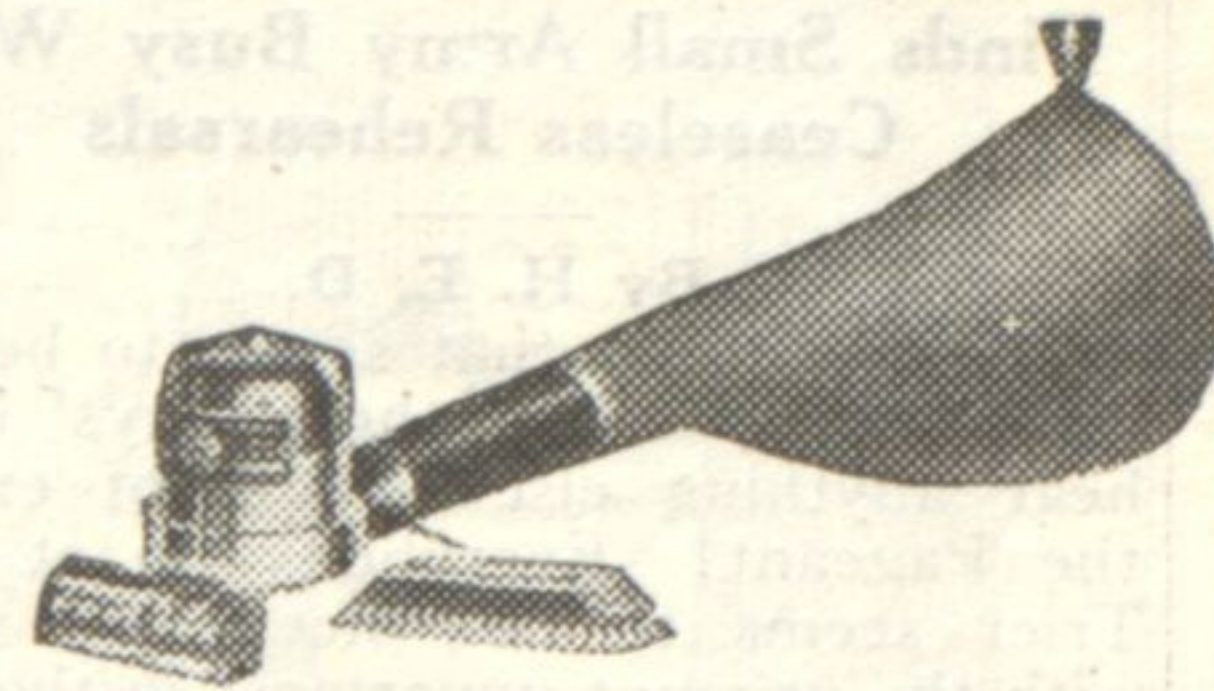

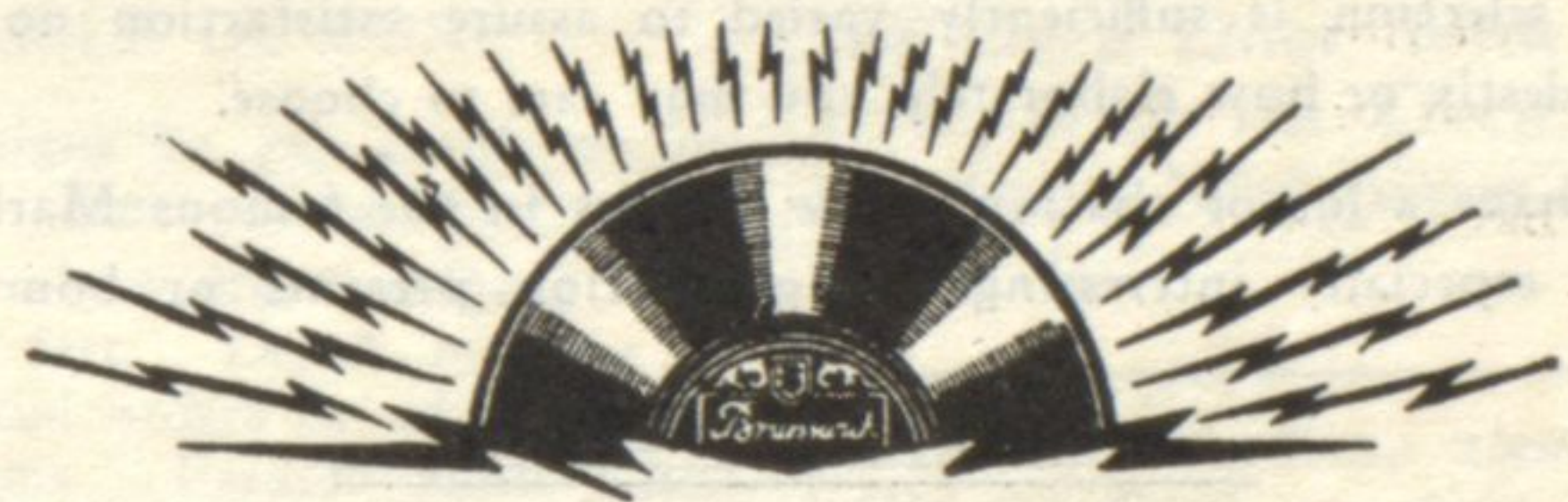
