of carpenters, 116 per cent; of common building labor, 122 per cent; of brick layers, 99 per cent; of all union labor, 114.3 per cent.

The number of teachers who are graduates of normal, of college, or of both normal and college, has increased 125 per cent since 1913.

Among the 48 state of the Union, Illinois ranks ninth in per capita income; fourth in per capita federal taxes on amusements; seventh in total income of internal revenue payments per capita; and fourth in income taxes paid per capita of population. Yet, with the latest data available, Illinois can be ranked not higher than sixteenth according to the Ayres' index of measuring the efficiency of states school systems.

We spend each year considerably more for tobacco than for education; three times as much for joy riding, races, pleasure resorts, and the like as we spend for education; and as much for soft drinks, perfumeries and cosmetics as for education. The average spent for both grades and high schools in 1924 was \$69.80 per pupil enrolled for current expenses and \$85.51 for all expenses.
