Board of Directors of National Kindergarten College Inspect New "Marienthal" Building

Members of the board of trustees of the National Kindergarten and Elementary college and their wives visited Marienthal, the new building of the college located at 2532 Asbury avenue, Evanston, Friday evening, May 28. Following dinner, which was served in the guests' dining room adjoining that of the students, the visitors had an opportunity of going through the building, which consists of an English basement and two stories, accommodating approximately 200 resident students.

The first floor includes a reception room and beautifully appointed lounge, study and practice room, hospital and laundry units and spacious dining room and kitchens.

The second and third floors provide

bedrooms for the students, each group of fifty girls being under the supervision of one of the four house mothers, Mrs. Stella Kahl, Mrs. C. C. Burlson, Miss Jeanette Hart and Mrs. Catherine Elmore. Each group of students has a separate parlor or living room with small adjoining kitchenette for candy-making of the serving of informal parties, and all student rooms are supplied with hot and cold running water. Mrs. Kenton Clarke is hostess of Marienthal, and has the oversight of the social activities of the students.

This building is the third "Marienthal" in the history of the National Kindergarten and Elementary college, and is named for Marienthal, the hall or castle occupied by the students in Frederick Froebel's first training school in "The Valley of the Marys."
