Frederick Edson Clerk, present principal at New Trier High school, ranks among the foremost educators in the country in the field pertaining to secondary instruction, as distinguished from elementary and college work. The coming of Mr. Clerk in 1923 marked a distinct advance in methods at New Trier by the introduction of what, in some respects, were regarded as daringly modern ideas. He has developed the advisor system to a fine degree and has been particularly interested in fostering a better basis of understanding between teacher and parent. He has been responsible, also, for the establishment of special visiting or inspection days on which the parents are brought to the school and requested to follow through the classwork of their children. Mr. Clerk was formerly associated with the Handley Foundation school-termed a model school for a small city-at Winchester, Va., which was supported by the Rockefeller Foundation.
