Dramatics have played a large part in the extra-curriculum activities at

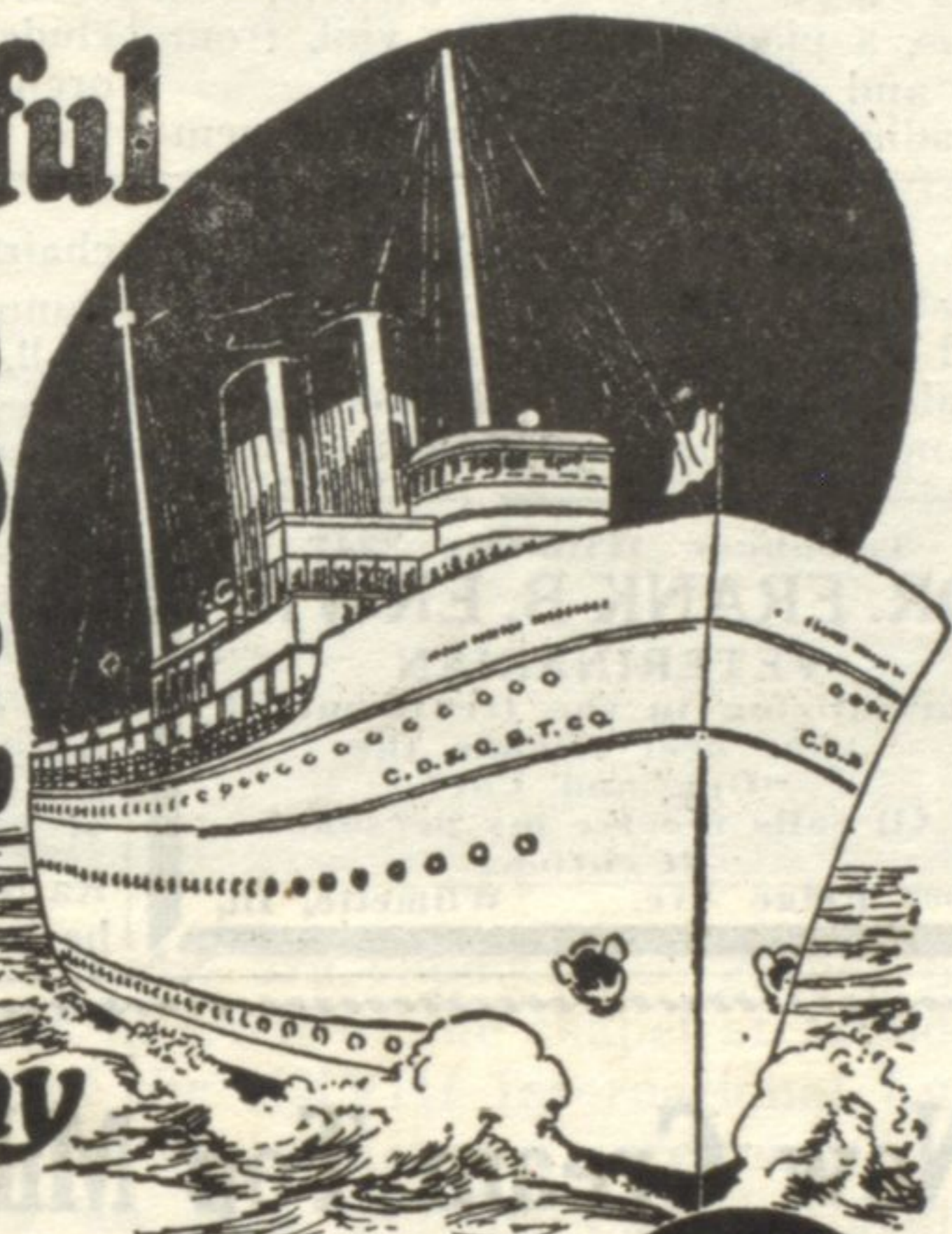
New Trier High school since its inception. The New Trier Dramatic club occupies a prominent and important place in the school today. Membership in this organization is earned by par-
