Add School of Education to Northwestern Courses

Northwestern university has added another school to its list of professional schools. A School of Education has been authorized by the board of trustees of the university, and will begin its work at the opening of the next school year. It will hold rank with the Schools of law, medicine, dentistry, commerce, speech and music, and will perform the service for those preparing to teach and for other educational positions that the other professional schools perform in their respective fields, it is explained. Prof. John E. Stout, professor of educational administration at Northwestern, has been appointed dean of the new school.

The organization of the new school is in harmony with the long established policy of the university to meet the demand for professionally trained teachers and school administrators, it is said. In the earlier days a few courses were offered in the college of liberal arts to meet this need. As the work developed need arose for a larger recognition of the work and a department of education was organized. The growth of this department has been rapid and there has been a constantly increasing registration in its courses.

The Golden Text was from Psalms 121:7, "The Lord shall preserve thee from all evil: he shall preserve thy soul."

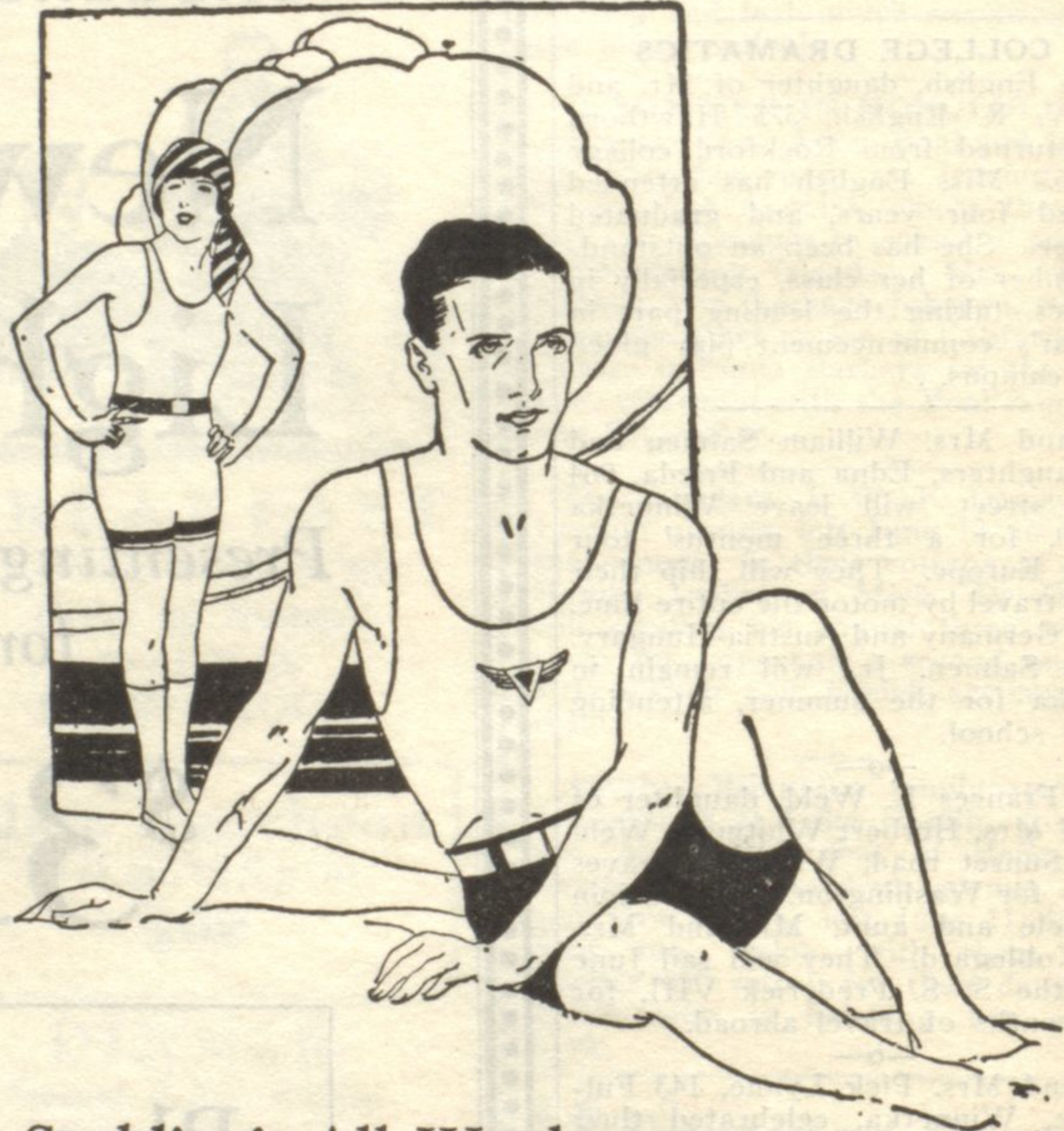

How excellent is thy loving kindness, O God! therefore the children of men put their trust under the shadow of thy wings" (Psalms 36:5-7).

The Lesson-Sermon also included the following passage from the Christian Science textbook. "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy: "In divine Science, man is sustained by God, the divine Principle of being. The earth, at God's command, brings forth food for man's use.
