Dedicate Imposing Masonic Monument Sunday

A monument of sheer massive granite, so designed that it will endure for centuries, will be dedicated by Masons of Evanston and other north shore cities at the North Shore cemetery Sunday afternoon. The ceremony is to begin at 2. Former Governor A. O. Eberhart of Minnesota will be the principal speaker. Masters of Masonic lodges in Evanston and neighboring communities have been invited to make short talks.

Hundreds of Masons are expected to attend the dedication, and the general public is invited. The cemetery is on the Green Bay road just west of North Chicago.

The monument is considered one of the most beautiful and imposing in America. It was designed by a 32nd degree Mason and carries out the symbolism of the Masonic order. It stands on a slope which faces the east. It is composed of three steps surmounted by three columns of pure Doric design. Masonic emblems are carved in the steps and in the architrave on the east side. The architrave on the west front bears the inscription, "To the Glory of Almighty God and in Memory of Those Who Have Passed the Unseen Portals."

Six carloads of granite went into the making of the monument, at a cost of \$20,000. The bottom step is a single slab of stone, 20 feet long, 6 feet wide and a foot thick. The next two steps are carved of one piece. The fluted columns also are monoliths, 3 feet in diameter at the base and 20 feet high. The largest single piece of stone in the monument is the cap stone which weighs 29,000 pounds. It took a crew of stone fitters with a derrick four days to put it in place.
