EDUCATORS LECTURE AT N. K. E. SUMMER SCHOOL

Students from Thirty States and Three Foreign Countries Register for Term

The opening of the summer session of the National Kindergarten and Elementary college this week was marked with the registration of students from thirty different states, from China, Bulgaria and Sweden. Former students of the college who have returned for advanced work are greatly interested in contrasting the present buildings and equipment with the former location in Chicago, and are enjoying the recreational opportunities offered by the north shore.

On Monday afternoon, Dr. E. Richardson of Northwestern university, gave the first of a series of addresses on "Current Educational Problems," to be given by outstanding educators during the summer session of the college, and to which the public is cordially invited.

Dr. Richardson pointed out the fact that educators today are interested in the child, not as a collection of isolated facts, but as a whole individual, a per-

sonality. The problem of the educator, therefore, is to understand how the individual child acts as a personality, what are the factors that enter into his experience and give it its outstanding characteristics, and how personality develops.

According to Dr. Richardson, personality develops through contact with various experiences, but not all experiences are of value in the education of the child. There are certain experiences, usually found in the satisfaction of four basic urges — the desire for achievement, for social recognition, for the satisfaction of curiosity and for new experiences — which will give the child the experiences necessary for the formation of his personality.

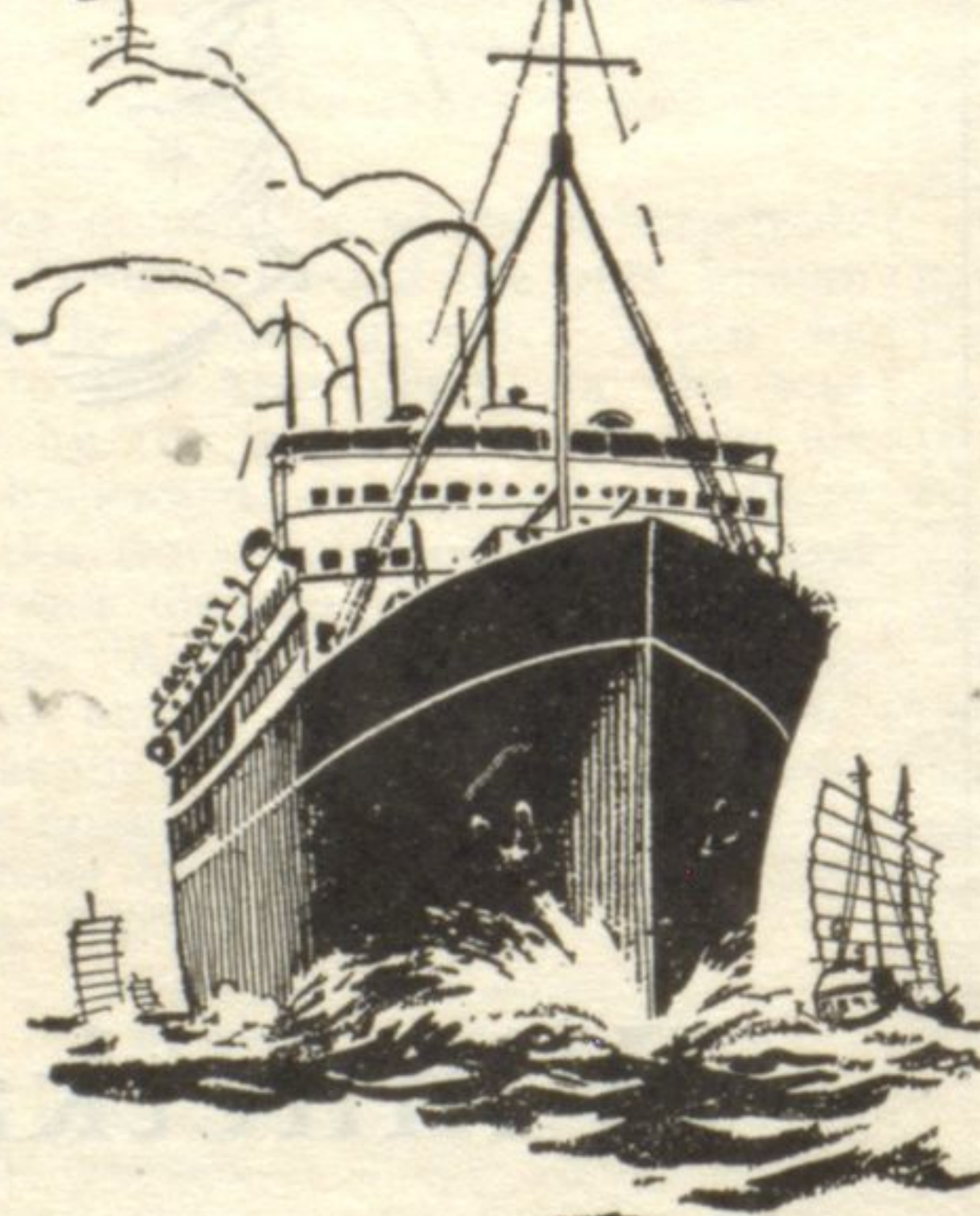
