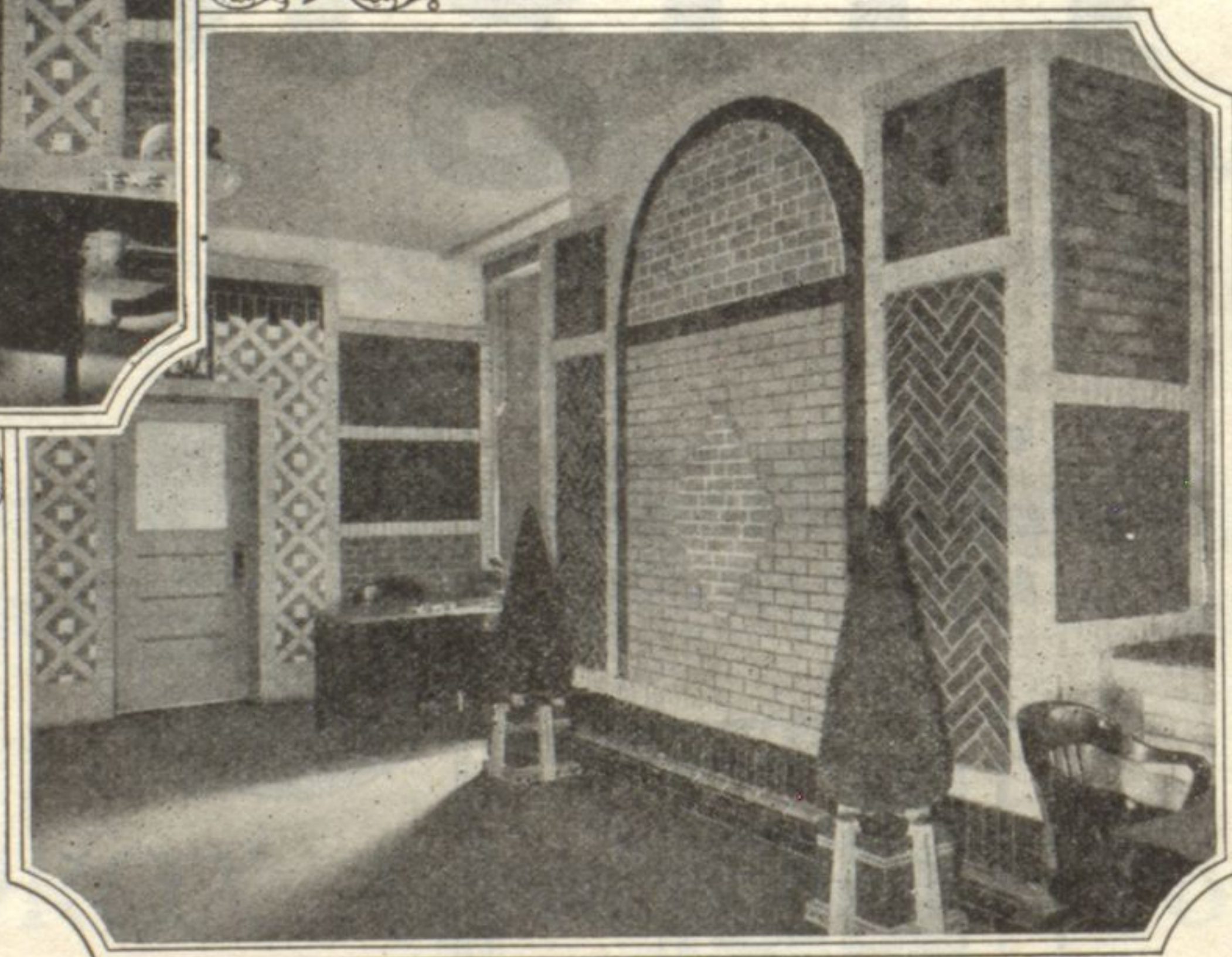
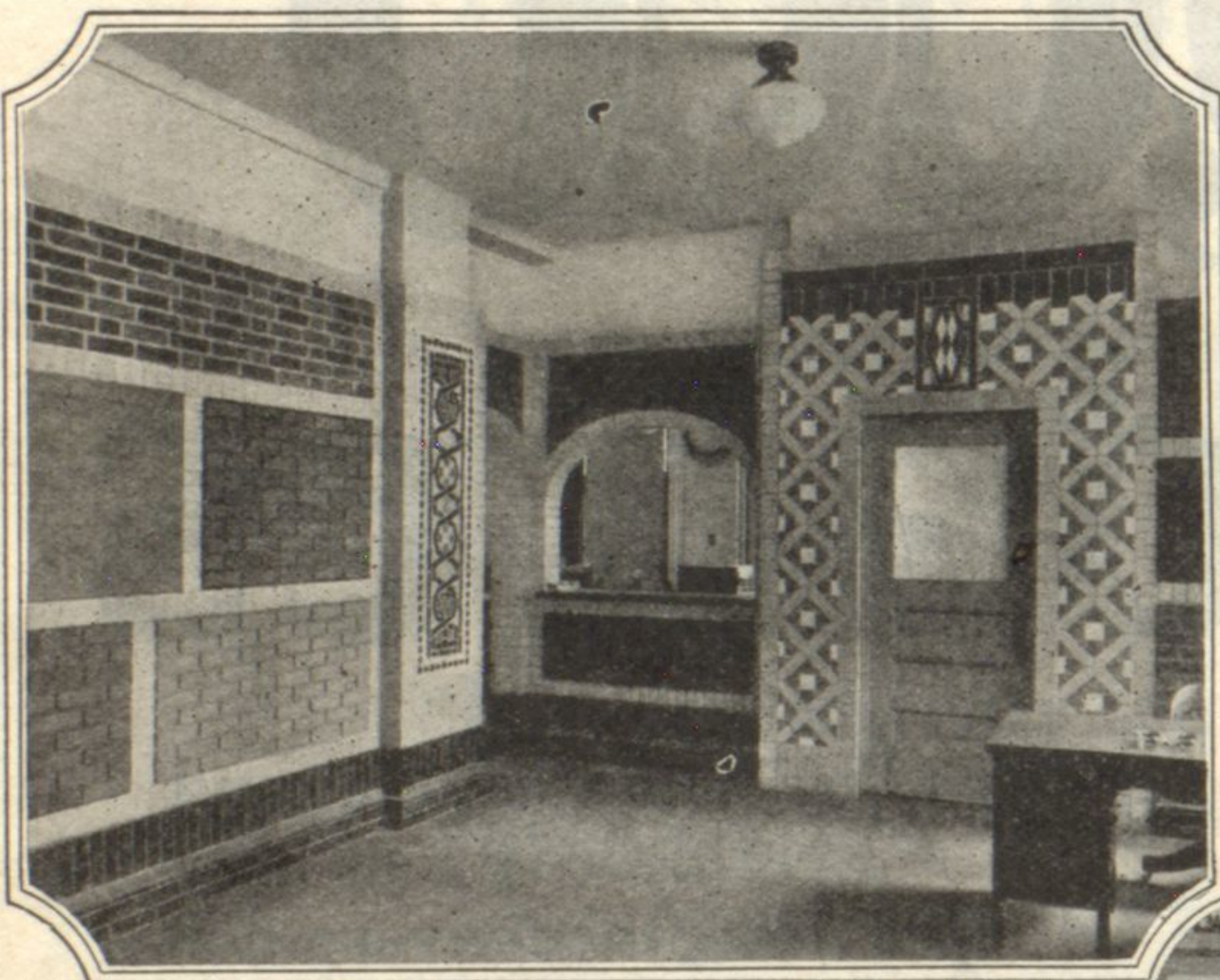
A reception at the bride's home, 725 Pine street, followed the ceremony.
