

### Charles Tyrell, Old Resident Here, Buried This Week

Charles T. Tyrell of 555 Ash street, a resident of Winnetka for 18 years, died at the Evanston hospital Wednesday morning, following a very brief illness.

Mr. Tyrell was in his seventy-seventh year. Although born in Waukegan, he spent practically his entire life here and in Chicago. For half a century he was actively affiliated with the commercial interests of Chicago, a part of that time in the real estate business. He never married.

His father, the late John A. Tyrell, first came to Chicago in 1845 and with the exception of a brief residence in Waukegan continued to reside there until his death. The only surviving member of the immediate family, Fred S. Tyrell, resides at 559 Arbor Vitae road, Winnetka.

Funeral services were conducted from the residence, Friday afternoon at 3 o'clock, by Rev. James Austin Richards, of the Winnetka Congregational church. Burial was at Rosehill cemetery.

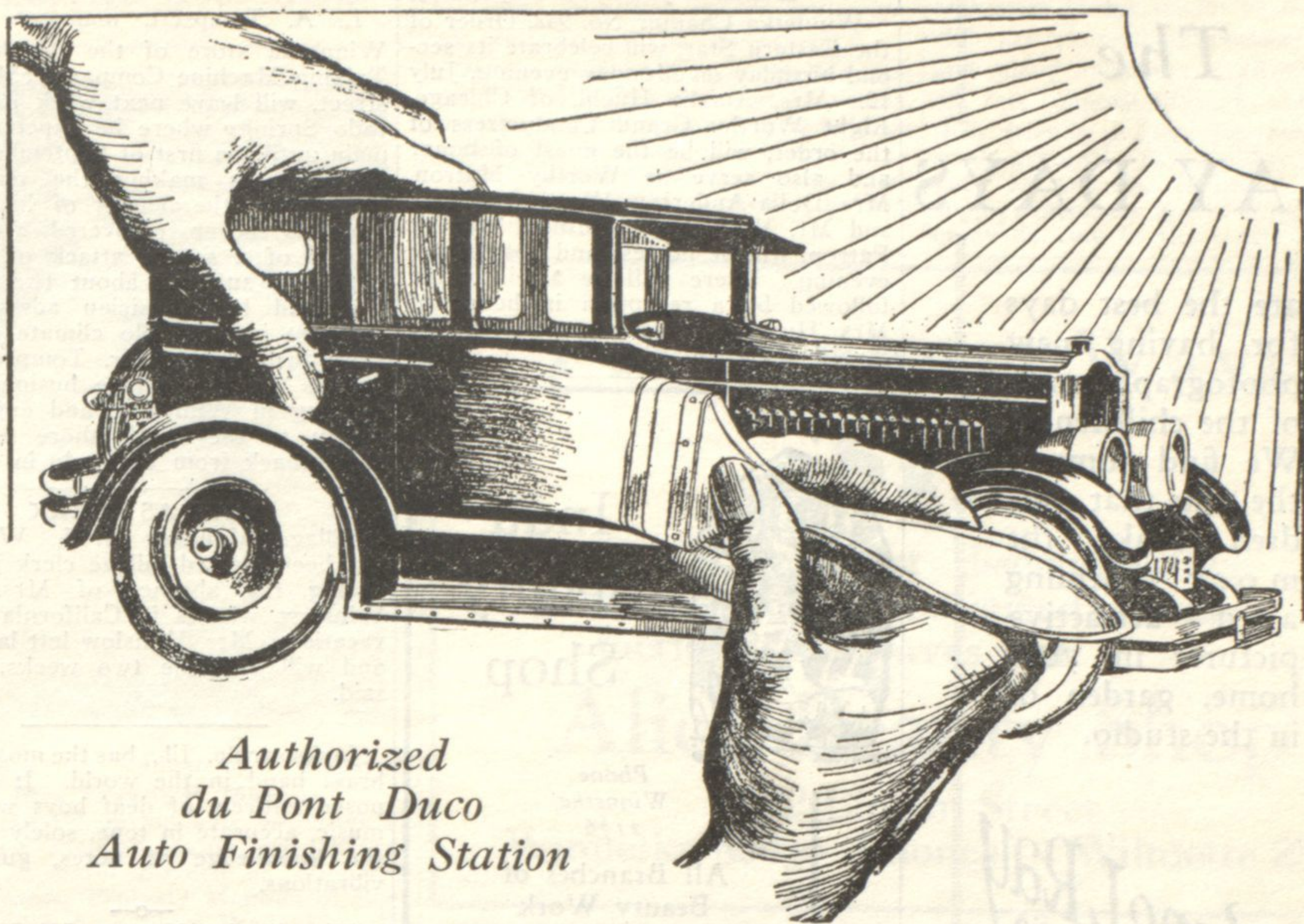
