"Aida" Next Tuesday

"Aida," which is always a favorite with all opera audiences, will be given on Tuesday night, August 17, with Elisabeth Rethberg in the title role and Giovanni Martinelli as Radames. As the Egyptian slave girl, Mme. Rethberg has the opportunity to display her dramatic voice to its fullest extent, and the arias which fall to her lot also demand that beauty of tone for which Mme. Rethberg is famous. Giovanni Martinelli enjoys universal acclaim as the greatest Radames of the present day, and like his vis-a-vis, he combines dramatic singing and tonal beauty with admirable mastery. Marlo Basiola is to be heard as Amonasro, one of the great baritone roles of opera; Leon Rothier will be Ramfis, the high priest and Louis D'Angelo the King. Mme. Bourskaya will have limitless chance for both singing and acting as Amneris. Mr. Papi will conduct.

Massenet's "Manon," one of the finest exemplifications of the French

school of composition, will be the offering on Wednesday night, August 18, with Lucrezia Bori again in the title role. This part demands unusual singing and acting, and Mme. Bori has fully demonstrated her ideal fitness for the role. Mario Chamlee will appear opposite her as the young DesGrieux, in which his beautiful lyric singing has captivated his audiences. Leon Rothier will be cast to excellent advantage as the elder DesGrieux. Others in the cast are Margery Maxwell, Ada Paggi, Philine Falco, Desire Defrere, Louis D'Angelo, Jose Mojia, Paolo Ananian, Louis Derman, Carlo Coscia, and Virgilia Grassi. Mr. Hasselmans will conduct.

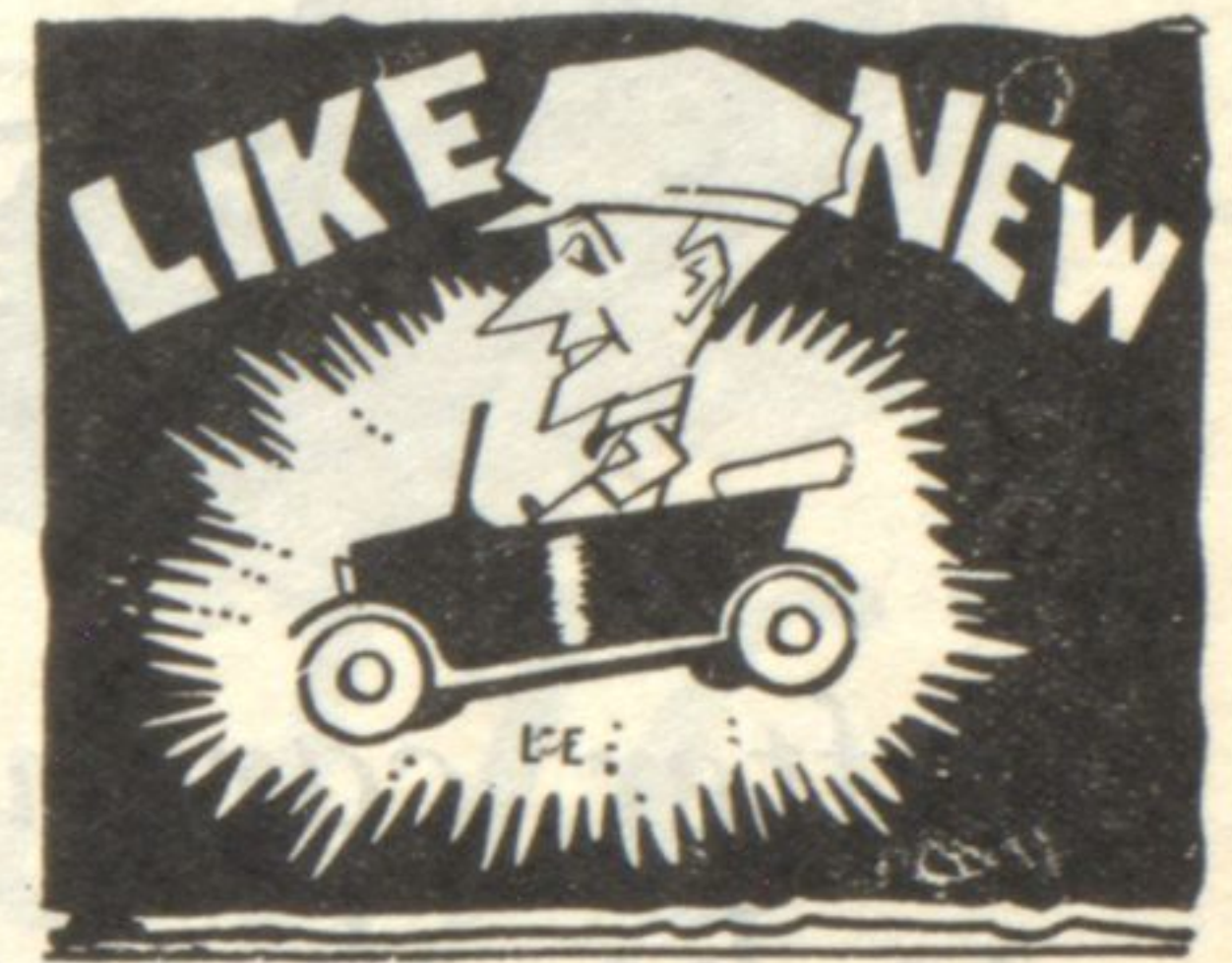

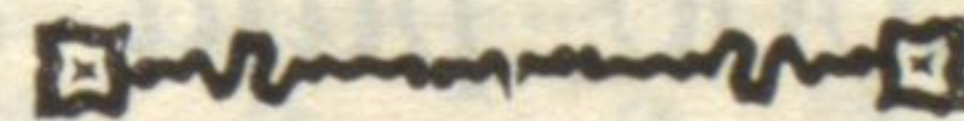
