#### Plan Extension of New M'Cormick Rd. Devon to Lincoln

Extension of McCormick boulevard from Devon avenue its present terminus, to Lincoln avenue along the north shore channel is proposed in the plans set forth this week by E. J. Kelly, chief engineer of the Sanitary district. Mr. Kelly announced that the four and a half mile stretch would be open in September.

The continuation of the road from Devon to Lincoln would provide outlets to the southeast and northwest. The project would cost about \$25,000 according to Mr. Kelly.




